Farmers and ranchers will not file a claim for refund of Federal tax on gasoline used on their farm or ranch as they have done in past years according to Ronald Gonch County Agent, Instead, the refund of Federal tax on gasoline used on or after July 1 1965, must be claimed as a credit on their annual income tax return.
This credit will first be taken on the return for the first full tax year beginning after June 30 , 1965. If the return is filed on a calendar year basis, the credit for gasoline tax refund taken on their
