

Austin-Colonel Homer Garri son Jr, director of the Texas Department of Public Safety bas announced that the 1967 vehicle inspection period has begun.

He said that the new inspection period began on Sept 1 and will ead on April 15, 1967 The inspection period is the same as in previous years

"This means that between now and April 15 1967, each of the five and one half million Texas registered vehicles will have to secure the new green and white 1967 inspection sticker from one of the 5500 official inspection stations," he said

In an effort to ease the man power shortage in the Texas Dept. of Public Safety, the Department's uniformed services have gone on a five day work week, as of September 1, 1966. Salaries have been raised to \$468.00 and \$484.00, depending on the branch of service.

At the present time there are some 125 vacancies in the uniformed services Applications for these vacancies are being accepted until October 17, 1966. The written examination will be given on October 22, 1966, with the training school beginning January 3. 1967.





# **Gasoline Tax Refund**

Farmers and ranchers will not file a claim for refund of Federal tax on gasoline used on their farm or ranch as they have done in past years according to Ronald Gooch County Agent, Instead, the refund of Federal tax on gasoline used on or after July 1, 1965, must be claimed as a credit on their annual income tax return.

This credit will first be taken on the return for the first full tax year beginning after June 30, 1965. If the return is filed on a calendar year basis, the credit for gasoline tax refund taken on their 1966 return will include the tax on gasoline used in the period from July 1, 1965 through December 31, 1966.




