He said that the new inspection period began on Sept 1 and will end on April 15, 1967 The inspection period is the same as in previous years


"This means that between now and April 15, 1967, each of the five and one half million Texas registered vehicles will have to secure the new green and white 1967 inspection sticker from one of the 5500 official inspection stations,"
