Amendment No 2, Authorizing creation of airport authorities composed of one or more counties.

Amendment No 3, Withdrawing Arlington State College from participation in the Permanent University Fund.

the permissible term of office for directors of conservation and reclamation districts from two to six years

Amendment No. 5, Authorizing the legislature to provide for s system of retirement, disability and death benefits for county officials and employees and others

Amendment No. 6, Providing for payment of assistance to survivors of law enforcement officers. custodial personnel of the Texas Department of Corrections, and full-paid firemen

Amendment No 7, Repealing the constitutional provision requiring a poll tax as a prerequisite to voting and requiring the legislature to provide for annual registration of all voters

Amendment No 8, Authorizing the legislature to enact laws permitting persons to vote for state officers and for president and vice president of the United States without having fulfilled residence requirements to vote for other officers, as well as laws permitting former residents of the state for a certain period, to vote absentee for president and vice president.

### Vehicle Inspection

Austin—Colonel Homer Garrison Jr, director of the Texas Department of Public Safety has announced that the 1967 vehicle inspection period has begun.

He said that the new inspection period began on Sept 1 and will end on April 15, 1967 The inspection period is the same as in previous years.

"This means that between now and April 15, 1967, each of the five and one half million Texas registered vehicles will have to secure the new green and white 1967 inspection sticker from one of the 5500 official inspection stations," he said

Garrison pointed out that Texas insection stations can be identified by the official vehicle inspection station sign displayed at each station
