Amendments

The first eight amendments were sketched in last week's Informer. Following are the remaining eight:

Amendment No. 9, Increasing to five the number of judges on the Texas Court of Criminal Appeals and lengthening the term of that court.

Amendment No. 10, Providing that taxes or bonds previously voted in any independent school district or in any junior college district shall not be abrogated, cancelled or invalidated by any change in boundaries and authorizing the continuance of the levy after such change without further election.

Amendment No. 11, Authorizing the issuance of an additional \$200 million in bonds by the Texas Water Development Board upon two-thirds vote of the legislature and expanding the uses to which money in the Texas Water Development Fund may be put.

Amendment No. 12, Providing the method and manner for dissolution of hospital districts.

Amendment No. 13, Authorizing the legislature to provide for consolidating the functions of government within a county having 12 million or more inhabitants and to provide for intergovernmental contracts between political subdivisions of the county.

Amendment No. 14, Allowing members of the armed forces to vote in Texas upon satisfying the residence requirements applicable to Texans in general.

Amendment No. 15, Authorizing the channeling of funds from private and federal sources through the state for use by privately owned or local agencies in establishing and equipping facilities to assist the handicapped in becoming gainfully employed.

Amendment No. 16, Establishing the date on which newly elected members of the legislature qualify to take office.

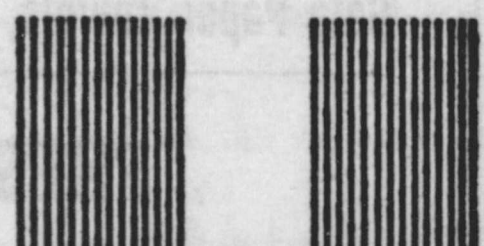


