Cotton Allotment Transfers

The Upland Cotton Program for 1967 provides that cotton allotments may be sold or leased for transfer to another farm within the county or may be transferred by a farm owner to another farm owned by him in any other county. Donley County producers disapproved the transfer of cotton by sale or lease outside the county. Farmers in Donley County can transfer cotton acreage under the following conditions:

1. Transfer by sale or lease from one farm to another within Donley County
2. Transfer by sale or lease from farms in other counties to farms in Donley County
3. Transfer by a farm owner to another farm owned or controlled by him within the State

Vehicle Inspection

Austin—Colonel Homer Garrison Jr., director of the Texas Department of Public Safety has announced that the 1967 vehicle inspection period has begun.

He said that the new inspection period began on Sept. 1 and will end on April 15, 1967. The inspection period is the same as in previous years.

"This means that between now and April 15, 1967, each of the five and one half million Texas registered vehicles will have to secure the new green and white 1967 inspection sticker from one of the 5500 official inspection stations," he said.

Garrison pointed out that Texas

inspection stations can be identified by the official vehicle inspection station sign displayed at each station.

Waco (Spl)—Final 1966 membership tabulation showed the Texas Farm Bureau increased its membership by 5,722 over last year, according to Wayne Little, organization director. Oct. 31 is the end of the TFB's membership year.

Total 1966 membership in the TFB is 100 926, first time ever for the 33 year old farm organization to pass the 100 000 mark in members. The Texas Farm Bureau, now fifteen times larger than the next biggest farm organization in the state, has shown an increase in members each year for the past 14 years
