Funeral services for Mrs Margie Myers Snelson, 39, who was killed early Monday in a car-truck collision a mile west of Hedley, were held Wednesday morning in the First Baptist Church here by Rev. C. H. Murphy and Rev. Cecil Guthrie. Burial was in Rowe Cemetery under direction of Spicer Funeral Home.

Her husband, R. D. Snelson, was reported in fair condition in a Memphis hospital. Carl Naylor of Clarendon, driver of the truck, was treated and released.

Mrs Snelson was born in Mena, Ark., and moved to Hedley three months ago. She and Mr. Snelson were married March 12, 1966. She was a Baptist.

Survivors besides her husband include two sons, Billy Clayton and Jackie Myers; a daughter, Sharon Clayton; four brothers, Henry Howard of Sayre, Okla., Thurman Howard of Duncan, Okla., Elmer Howard of Yuba City, Calif., and Robert L. Howard of San Bernardino Calif.; and a half-brother, Frank Dilbeck of Mena, Ark.

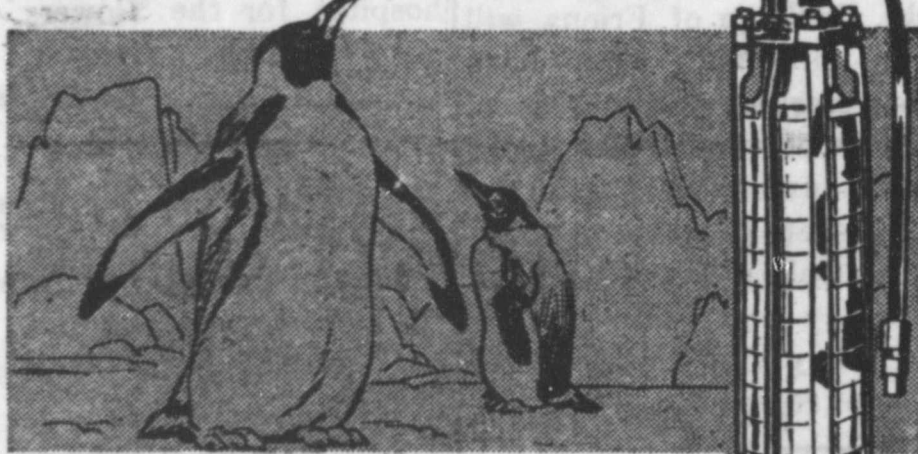

Overseas Mail

Postmaster Davis of Hedley today announced that henceforth all first class mail, personal sound recordings (voice letters) and parcels weighing 5 pounds or less and measuring not more than 60 inches in length and girth combined, will be airlifted on a space available basis between the United States and all military post offices overseas.

Also second class publications such as newspapers and magazines published weekly or more often, and featuring current news of interest to the military, will be airlifted from San Francisco to the armed forces serving in Viet Nam.

The parcels described above will be moved by surface transportation within the United States from the points of mailing to the port of embarkation, and to speed up separation and delivery of parcels within this category, they will be clearly marked upon acceptance at the Post Office with the letters SAM (Surface Airlift Mail), to eliminate reweighing and measuring the parcels at San Francisco.

Postmaster Davis also reminded mailers that Christmas parcels weighing 5 pounds and under, though they are given airlift priority from San Francisco to Viet Nam on a space available basis, should be mailed no later than December 1.

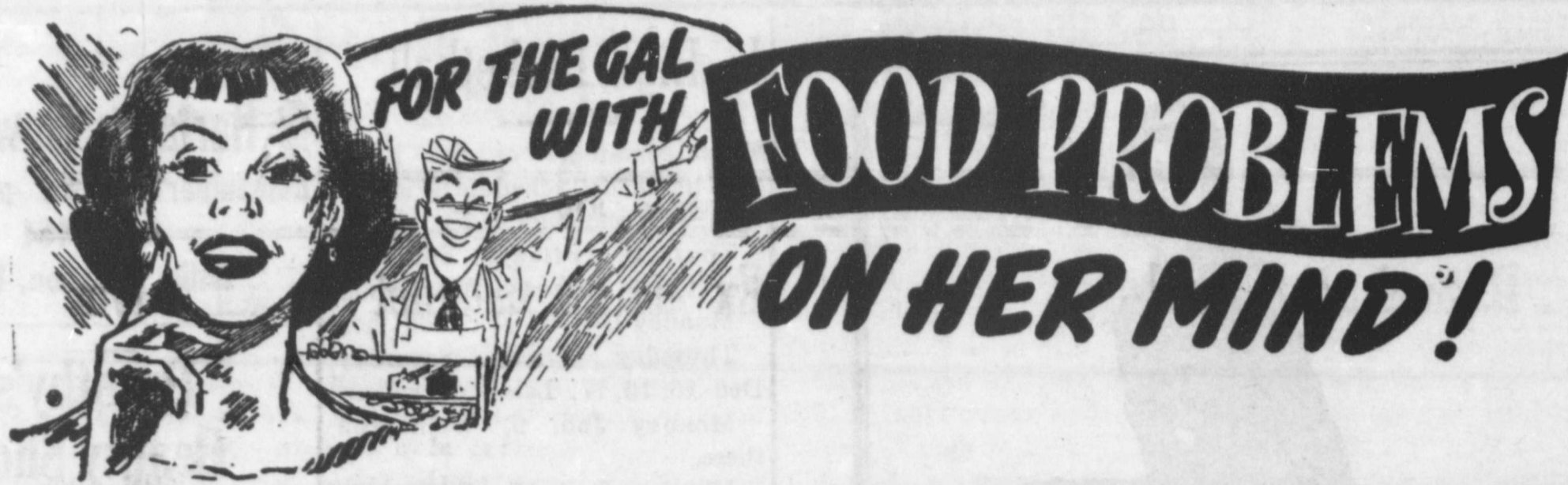
