Swine Breeding

The building and improving of swine breeding herds in the Hedley community is moving forward and should prove a boon to the local economy

Herlie Moreman recently purchased the breed champion boar of the Louisiana state fair and the Albuquerque, N Mex, fair and two Poland China gilts from the Bernard McClellan herd of McLean.

Curtis Mullins secured a Poland China breeding gilt from Wayman Bros of Galtry Okla This is one of the leading Poland herds in the nation Mullins also has some of the McClellan gilts

R. H. Couch bought a young Duroc boar from the Herb Bryan herd of Seminole, Texas He also bought several purebred Duroc gilts from Wendell Hansard

Himon and Wayland Fronterhouse recently purchased three purebred Berkshire gilts from Earth, Texas.

Several other local farmers have already begun or have plans for starting swine enterprises.

Cotton Report

As cotton harvesting and ginning accelerated during the week, the quality of Eastern Panhandle cotton classed was lower, except the staple length improved over the previous week, according to the USDA's Consumer and Marketing Service in Memphis, Texas.

K. E. Voelkel in charge of the Cotton Division's classing office stated that the sample receipts during the week held steady at about 4,000 samples per day The 7 classers assigned to this seasonal office classed 24,000 samples during the week ending Thursday, December 1 This brought the total for the season to 51,000 compared with 41,000 samples as of the same date a year ago. It was estimated that the 57 gins in this 12 county area were well over 50 percent completed. Last season nearly 200,000 samples were classed in this office.

Tuberculosis Tests

The West Texas Tuberculosis Association's Mobil Chest X-ray Unit will be in Silverton all day Saturday, Dec. 10, beginning at 9:00 and lasting as long as there are those wanting x-rays made, sponsored by L. O. A. Junior Study Club and the Silverton Lions Club.

The Mobil Unit will be parked near the school gymnasium, and those who plan to attend the Silverton Basketball Tournament are invited to have their tuberculosis checkups when they go to the games.

Cost of bringing the Mobil Unit to Silverton will be \$200.00 and \$1 00 a picture for all over 200. For this reason, those who have their chests x-rayed will be asked to donate \$1 00 to help defray costs

L O A Junior Study Club members will be acting as hostesses and clerks for the Unit, and the technician to take the x-rays and have the film read will be furnished by the West Texas Tuberculosis Association.

Those with negative film will receive post cards, and those with some abnormality will be notified by letter.

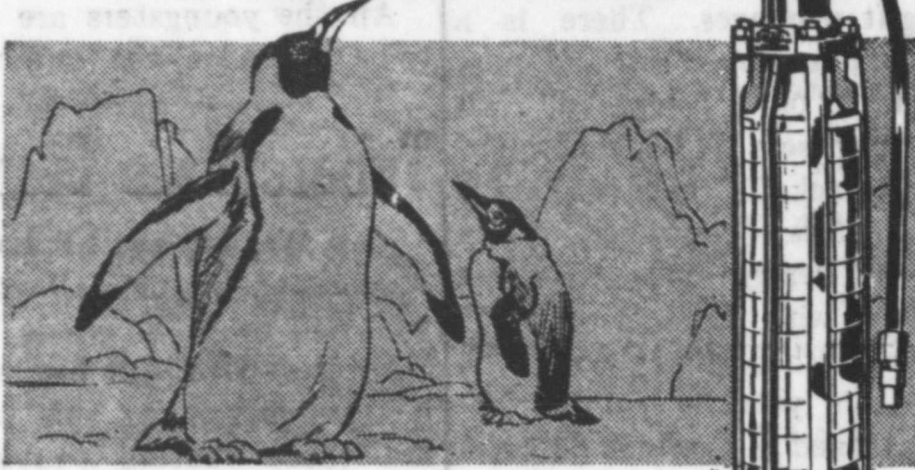

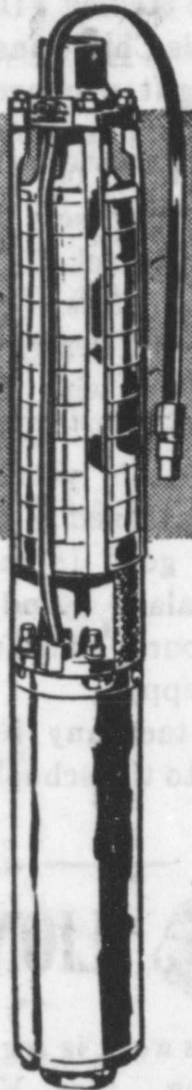

Cotton Referendum

The Cotton Marketing Quota Referendum is now in progress. A yes vote by at least two thirds of the farmers voting will mean a cotton program next year which includes allotments and quotas, marketing penalties on excess cotton, diversion payments, price support loans and payments. A no vote by more than a third of those voting would mean price support loans at 50 percent of parity to growers who keep within their farm allotments and no cotton program. The choice will be made by those who vote.

If you're a cotton farmer, you should have received a ballot from the ASCS county office along with other information explaining the vote. This year a second referendum is being held at the same time to decide whether farmers want to finance a new research and promotion program for cotton. Be sure to mark both ballots, and mail them in to this office, or return them in person, not later than December 9.

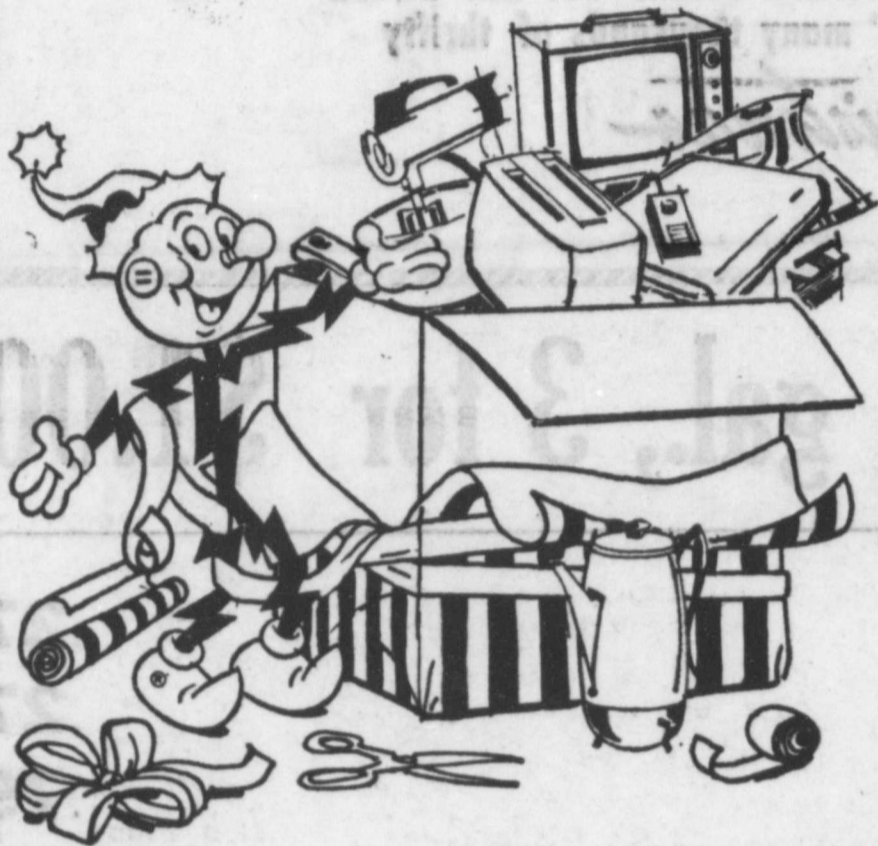
