## Doyle Messer To Receive Award

In commemoration of their 5th year of service as Advisors to Young Farmer Chapters, twenty vo-ag teachers are slated to receive 5 year tenure awards at the 13th Annual Young Farmer Convention, which will be held in Corpus Christi, Jan 13-14.

Some 310 vo-ag teachers in the public high schools of Texas are currently sponsoring Young Farmer education programs in which there are over 4600 members.

The program of a local chapter is planned annually on a 12 month basis by committees composed of Young Farmers and the local advisor. Twelve month programs encompass all phases of production agriculture as well as recreation, leadership, and community service activities. Since vo-ag teachers serve as Young Farmer advisors in addition to their regular assignments and without extra pay, education programs reach over 4600 young men without cost to anyone.

Among the teachers who will receive 5th anniversary tenure awards (a Young Farmer pin set with a diamond) is Doyle Messer of Hedley.

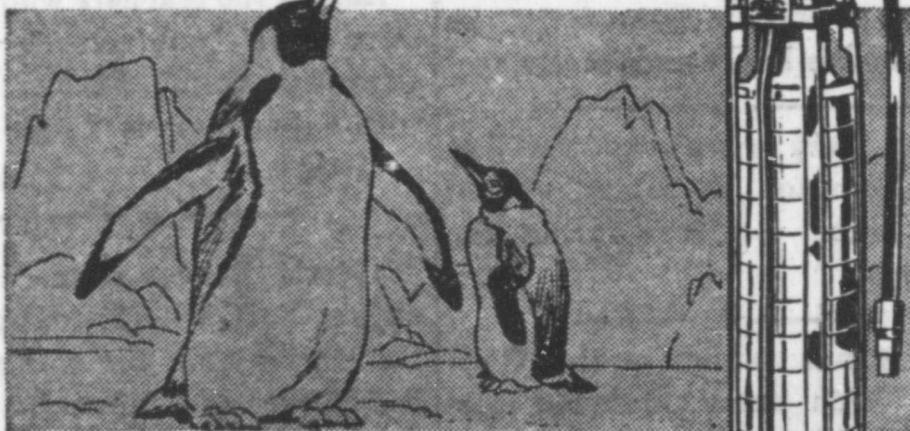

### Housing Credit

The U S Department of Agriculture's Farmers Home Administration is better equipped to handle the housing credit needs of low and moderate income Donley County families as a result of legislation recently signed into law, according to Claude Moore, Farmers Home Administration county supervisor

Moore said the Demonstration Cities and Metropolitan Development Act, signed last month by President Johnson, makes it possible for a broader range of Donley County families to qualify for housing credit under expanded

housing loan authorities of the Farmers Home Administration.

The new legislation, Moore continued, makes more mortgage credit available to low and moderate income families in Donley County by increasing the level of activity of the agency's rural housing loan program

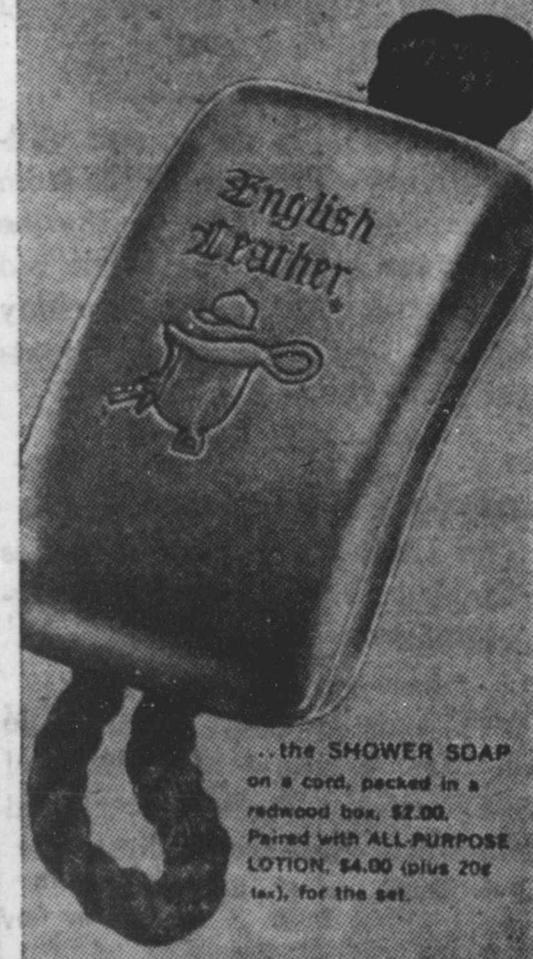

**4-H DAIRY SHOW**

THE 4-H girl or boy who holds the ribbon or receives a trophy for a dairy animal at the fair has put in hundreds of hours caring for the animal. They usually start with a calf from the farm herd or a calf they have purchased with money earned from 4-H projects.

A visit to the 4-H division of the fair and a talk with the 4-H'ers will reveal that they have not only worked hard to make the main event, but have learned a lot in the process. Preparing an animal for the show ring, they say, takes a lot of skill, time and patience. The 4-H dairy project also is the training ground for cattle judges. Club members making the judging team travel to county and state fairs and to the large regional and national shows as well. Their achievements do not go unrecognized. This year nearly two thirds of all the counties in the U.S. are expected to name some 6,000 medal winners, says the National 4-H Service Committee. The medals, plus state and national awards will be provided for the 10th straight year by the Oliver Corporation, sponsor of the national 4-H Dairy program.

All winners are chosen by the Cooperative Extension Service which supervises 4-H work.

1967 Cotton, Feed Grain and Wheat Signup

Sign-up for the 1967 cotton, feed grain wheat programs will begin Feb 6, 1967, and continue through March 3. This means that sign-up period will last only

four weeks. Notices of yield, payment rates, bases, allotments, and conserving bases will be mailed to you in January.

#### New Growers Cotton Allotment

Jan. 17, 1967 is the final date for applying for a 'new Grower's' cotton allotment. Neither the operator nor the owner of the farm covered by the application can own or operate any other farm in the United States for which a cotton allotment is established for the current year. Land must be suitable for production of cotton, and the operator must expect

more than 50% of his income from agricultural commodities excluding cotton production from the farm

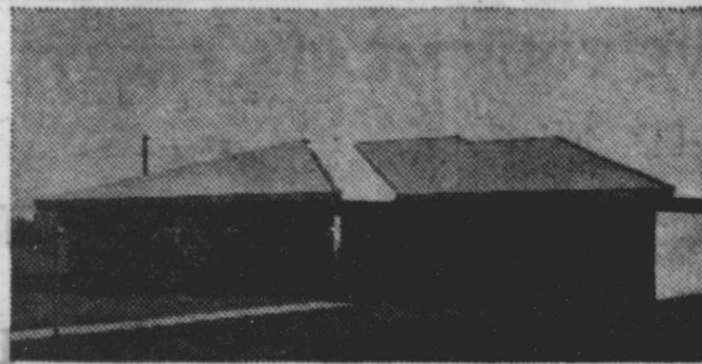
