Voters of this area are reminded that the deadline for registering to vote this year is Tuesday Jan 31. Persons between 21 and 60 years old who do not register by the deadline will not be able to

The poll tax is no longer required for voting, but everyone membership in its task of winning between the ages of 21 and 60 who the lost and helping Christians plans to vote must register to be grow into the kind of person God eligible. Registration is, not required for persons aged 60 or over who live in a city of less than 10,000 population. There is no charge for registration. Registration may be made by a qualified voter only for himself, spouse, mother, father, son or daughter. A representative of the sheriff's office will be in Hedley at the City Hall on Saturday, Jan. 28, from 10 a m. to 4 p.m., in order to assist residents of Hedley and surrounding area to register. Vehicle Inspection


Austin-Col Homer Garrison, Jr., director of the Texas Department of Public Safety has remind ed Texas motorists that most vehicles have not yet been inspected for their 1967 vehicle inspection sticker.

"The inspection period is twothirds over and only about one-

third of the vehicles have been inspected," said Garrison. "This means that during the weeks remaining before the April 15 deadline for inspections, more than twice as many persons each week must have their car inspected to avoid long lines forming at the end of the period."
