## Cal Farley

The entire area was saddened Sunday when news came of the death of Cal Farley, 71, nationally known founder of Boys Ranch, who collapsed while attending chapel services at the ranch.

Funeral services were tentatively set for 4:30 p. m. Tuesday in Tascosa High School in Amarillo.

Mr. Farley was born Dec 25, 1895 in Saxton Iowa. He came to Amarillo in 1923 after having served overseas in World War I. He promoted wrestling for a time, then went into business, and in 1939 founded the world famous Boys Ranch, which has given a new life to over 1,700 boys during its existence.

It is good to know that the institution he founded will continue the good work which he directed for so many years.

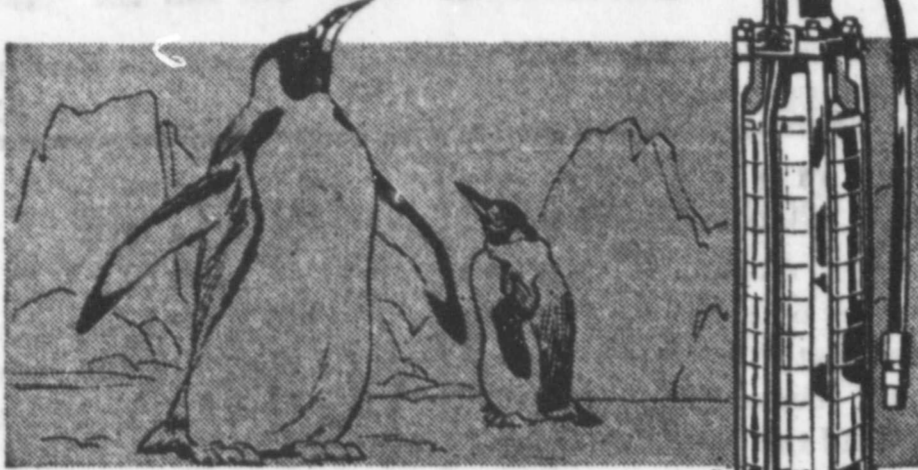
## Vehicle Registration

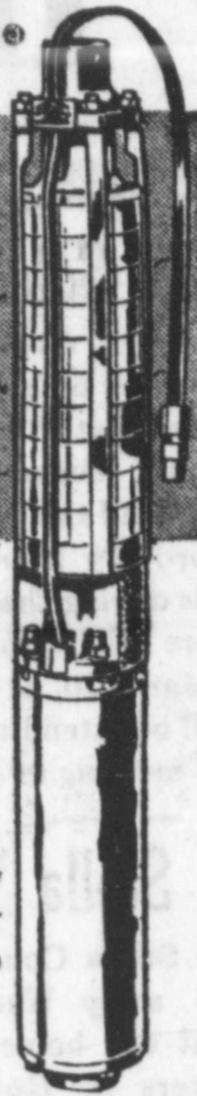

### Change In 1967 Wheat

Any acreage of wheat grazed after May 1 will be considered wheat. This is a change that could affect your cattle grazing program.

### Substitution

The substitution provision is the same for 1967 as it was for 1966. Wheat may be substituted for feed grains or feed grains for wheat if you sign up in both programs.

### Signup Date Extended

The signup date for the 1967 cotton feed grain and wheat annual programs has been extended until March 17. The final date to release extra cotton or to request extra cotton is still March 3.

### Measurement Services

The measurement service for wheat is available. The staking service for cotton, feed grain, and diverted acreages is also available. Charges for these services will vary for the individual farms, so if you're interested, come in and talk with us.


