

All qualified Notaries Public desiring re-appointment for the new term which begins June 1, 1967, and ends June 1, 1969, must pay the required fee and file a new application, oath and bond with the County Clerk of his or her residence between May 1, 1967 and May 15, 1967, inclusive.

for re-appointment or for commissions directly to the Secretary of State inasmuch as the law specifically requires the County Clerks approve Notary Bonds and forward copies of the application to the Secretary of State

commission as a Notary Public must be at least 21 years of age, a citizen of the United States and of Texas and a resident of the County for which he is appointed.

Any person not now a Notary Public who desires appointment for the beginning of the new term should apply to his or her County Clerk before May 20, 1967




