Until recently funds were available for families with low and moderate incomes.

Mr Moore said home financing for families of above moderate income can be resumed by the agency under a new allocation of lending authority granted by President Johnson A Presidential order March 17 authorized the agency to insure \$25 million more in housing loans to families of the upper income group between now and June 30
