A. S. C. News

Aerial Photographs—In response to the many inquiries, we have been advised that new aerial maps are being made at this time in the area which includes Donley County. However, in all probability, they will not be ready for use until crops are measured during the summer of 1968.

Acreage Certifications—as soon as you are sure of your final crop and diverted acreage, come in and certify to these acreages. The earlier certifications are made, the sooner we will be able to make payments.

We have been advised that payments may be made a little quicker this year than last if producers turn in their acreages early.

Measurement Service—July 21, 1967, is the final date to request this service for 1967 row crops and diverted acreages. If you desire this service, come in now and sign up. The cost of having your crops measured by someone from the office would be \$9.50 for the farm visit, office work, and measurement of one plot. Each additional plot would be \$2.00.

Borrowed Tapes and Pins—If you have borrowed a tape and pins from this office with which to measure your crops, please return them as soon as you are through. At this time all of our loan out tapes are out of the office and many producers are waiting for one to use.

It has been brought to the attention of the Sheriff's Department of Donley County, Texas, that in plowing and cultivating their fields, farmers have been using the county roads to turn their equipment around; thereby making deep cuts in the right of way and injuring the roads to such an extent that they are dangerous to the general public. This must be stopped. Art. 784 of Texas Penal Code provides as follows:

Whoever shall wilfully obstruct or injure or cause to be obstructed or injured in any manner whatsoever any public road or highway or any street or alley in any town or city, or any public bridge or causeway, within this State, shall be fined not exceeding two hundred dollars.

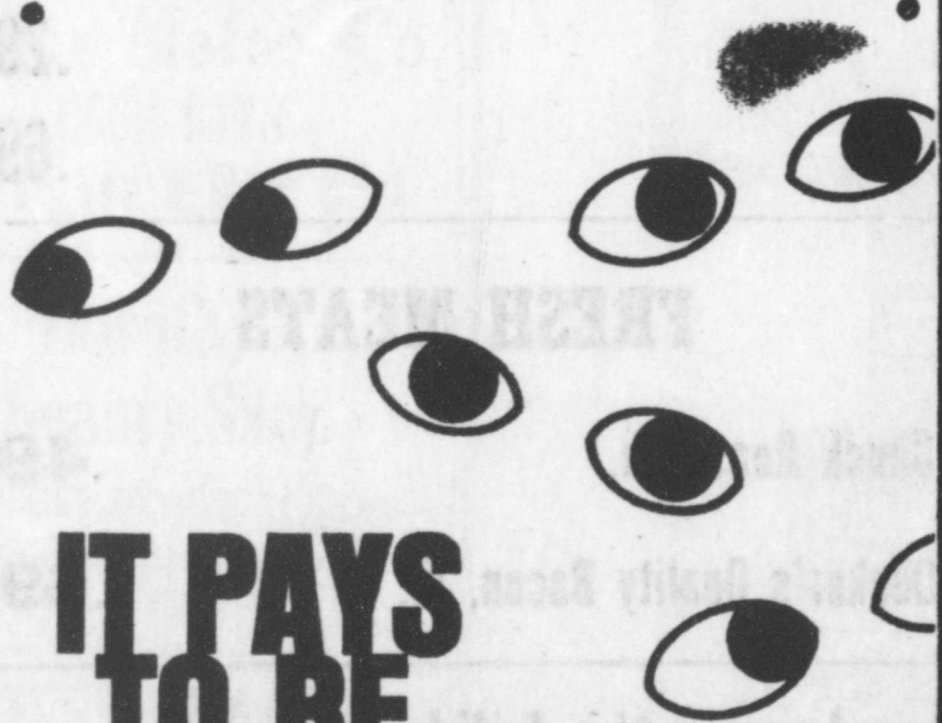
