Emphasis will be given to evaluation of the total homemaking education program. All vocational education programs are to be evaluated in 1968. At the conference the group will have the opportunity to react to the evaluative instrument which will be used in public schools during the coming year

Neely, Program Development, Evaluation and Coordination of Vocational Education, and Homemaking Consultants, Margaret Scholl and Mrs. Elizabeth F. Smith, Director, Division of Homemaking Education.

Approximately 2,000 homemaking teachers are expected to attend the meetings The home economics education program in the state is under the direction of the Division of Homemaking Education, State Department of Education, of which Mrs Smith is the director. Teachers meet annually for training in new developments and trends in homemaking education
