Final Payments

Final payments will be computed by the New Orleans Commodity Office this year. As soon as possible after acreages are reported, program documents will be sent to them. It will then take the commodity office about 10 days to compute the payments, prepare the drafts and return them to us. Wheat checks can then be released immediately; cotton and feed grain checks can be released on August 28. So you can see if you certify now, you will be able to get your checks earlier.

Diverted Acres

Farm operators are reminded that diverted acres are to be maintained the entire year in an acceptable manner. Due to the recent rains additional plowing may be necessary to control weeds and thistles on this land. Don't let the weeds take your payments!

Soil Bank Farms

If yours is a soil bank farm, a reporter from this office will measure your crops at no cost to you. You will not be required to certify to the acreages planted and—or diverted.

We ask your cooperation in going with the reporter who visits your farm. Please go with him, or if that is impossible, have a representative who can help him.

Sams Back From Nashville, Tenn.

Supt. R. K. Sams arrived home Sunday after attending a six weeks term at George Peabody College for Teachers at Nashville, Tenn.

Mr. Sams had been awarded an advanced study fellowship in educational media at the college. There were 35 participants from 23 different states.

The course Mr. Sams studied was designed to promote marked advancement in educational leadership relative to educational media and new instructional materials and techniques.

Back From Viet Nam

Major Adrian D. Youngblood was at home last week after completing a 12 month tour with the U. S. Air Force in Vietnam. While stationed at DaNang Air Base he flew 254 combat missions as a Rescue helicopter pilot, and rescued 20 U. S. personnel including many downed pilots in North Vietnam. On one rescue mission his helicopter was shot down by communist groundfire. On another flight while recovering a downed Marine pilot, his aircraft sustained 48 bullet holes. He was awarded 2 Silver Stars, 2 Distinguished Flying Crosses, 13 Air Medals, and a Purple Heart. His Rescue unit, nick-named the "Jolly Green Giants," received the Presidential Unit Citation for outstanding performance.

Major Youngblood's next assignment is to the Air Force Missile Development Center at Holloman AFB, near Alamogordo, New Mexico. His wife, Grace, and two daughters resided in Oklahoma City while he was in Vietnam.

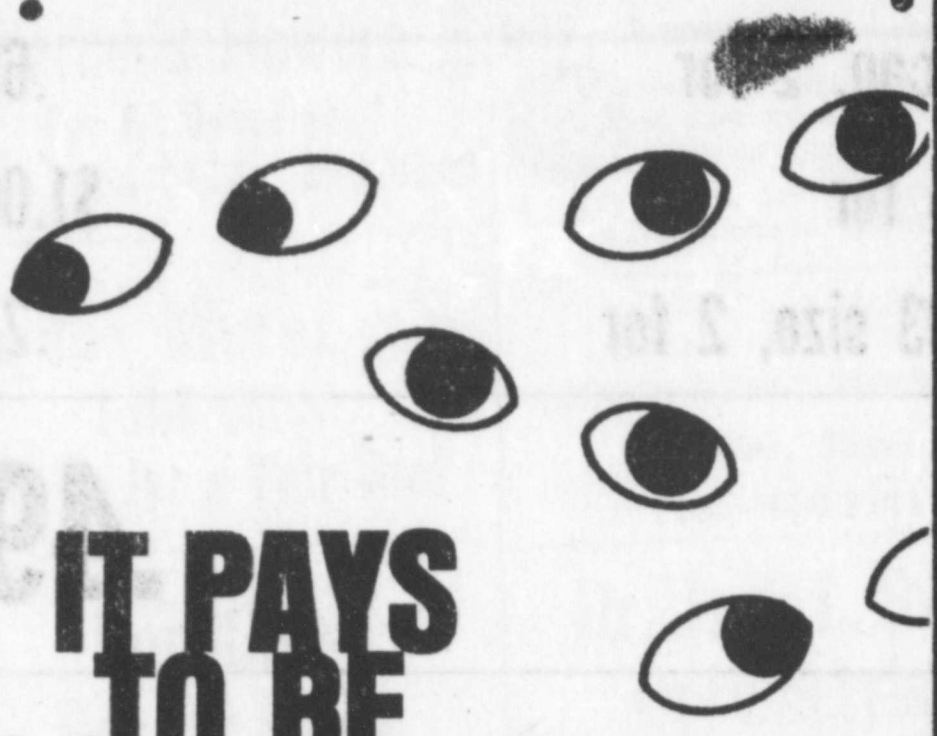
