Greenbelt Water

It is likely that at some time in the near future the Greenbelt Water Authority will begin furnishing water to the City of Hedley. Rates for such service were set up by the City Council on Sept. 5, 1963, to take effect when the city began getting water from the Greenbelt Authority In case anyone has forgotten, the rates are as follows:

First 2,000 gallons (minimum) \$3.00

Next 8,000 gallons 60¢ per 1 000 Next 10,000 gallons 55¢ per 1,000 Next 10,000 gallons 50¢ per 1,000 Next 10,000 gallons 45¢ per 1,000 Over 40,000 gallons 40¢ per 1,000

Over 40,000 gallons 40¢ per 1,000 It should be pointed out that these rates were set up and published before the election to join the Greenbelt Water Authority was held. The election was held on Sept 28, 1963, and almost 90% of the eligible voters took part in the election The count was 188 for joining the Authority, and none opposed, making the vote unanimous to join the / uthority.

Vehicle Inspection

Texas motorists will find higher standards will be required in automotive safety inspections starting August 28 The inspection period will continue through the usual deadline, April 15

A new provision is the increased inspection fee, from \$1 00 to \$1.75. Under the new law, front seat belts are required on every vehicle which had seat belt anchorages as as part of the original equipment. This includes all American made passenger cars beginning with 1962

The new regulations also take in two more new areas, calling for mechanics to inspect steering and rims. Stickers will not be issued to vehicles with loose steering or in which the steering wheel cannot be turned from full right to full left without jamming, nor to vehicles with defective or bent rim flanges, or with loose or missing bolts, nuts or lugs

Donley County residents are urged to obtain their safety inspections as soon as possible, since more than 3,800 vehicles must be checked at official inspection stations before the April 15 deadline
