Austin-Col Homer Garrison, director of the Department of Public Safety, reminded Texans today that any person, regardless of age, must have a birth certificate or other legal document showing birthdate in possession at the time they first make application for a driver license.

"Apparently many applicants are unfamiliar with this new requirement in the law," Garrison advised, "and large numbers of prospective drivers are being turned away until they return home and get such a document. 
