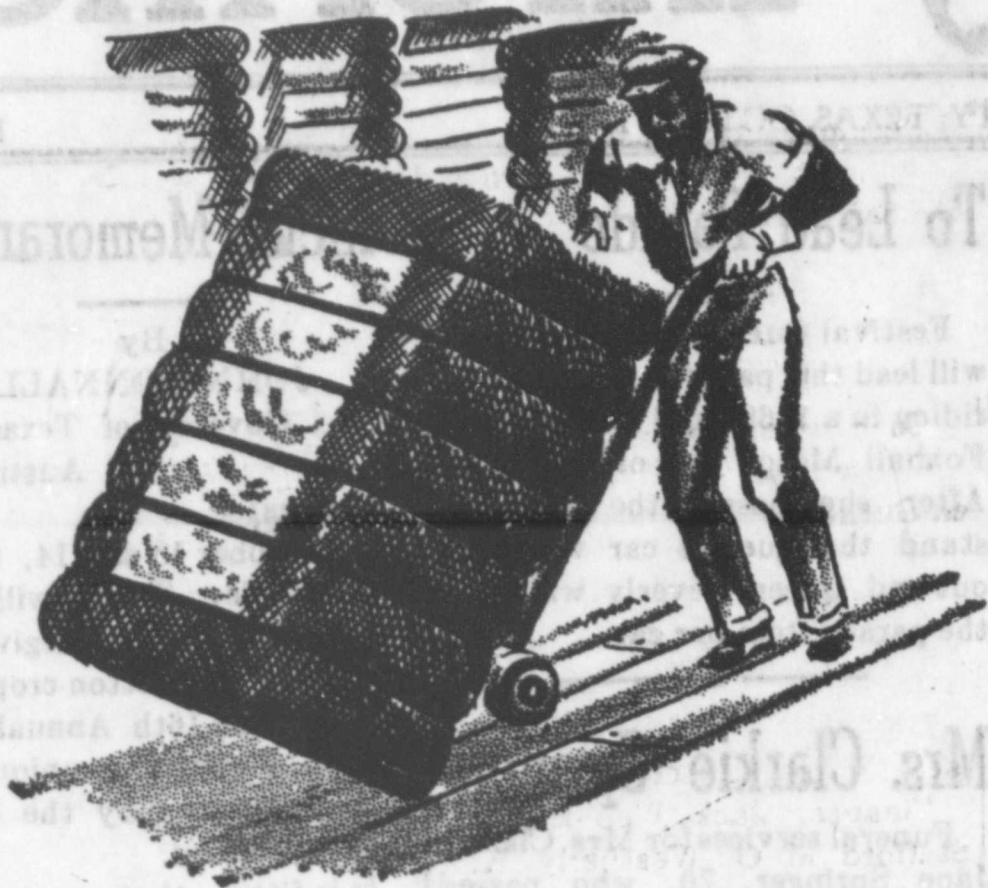

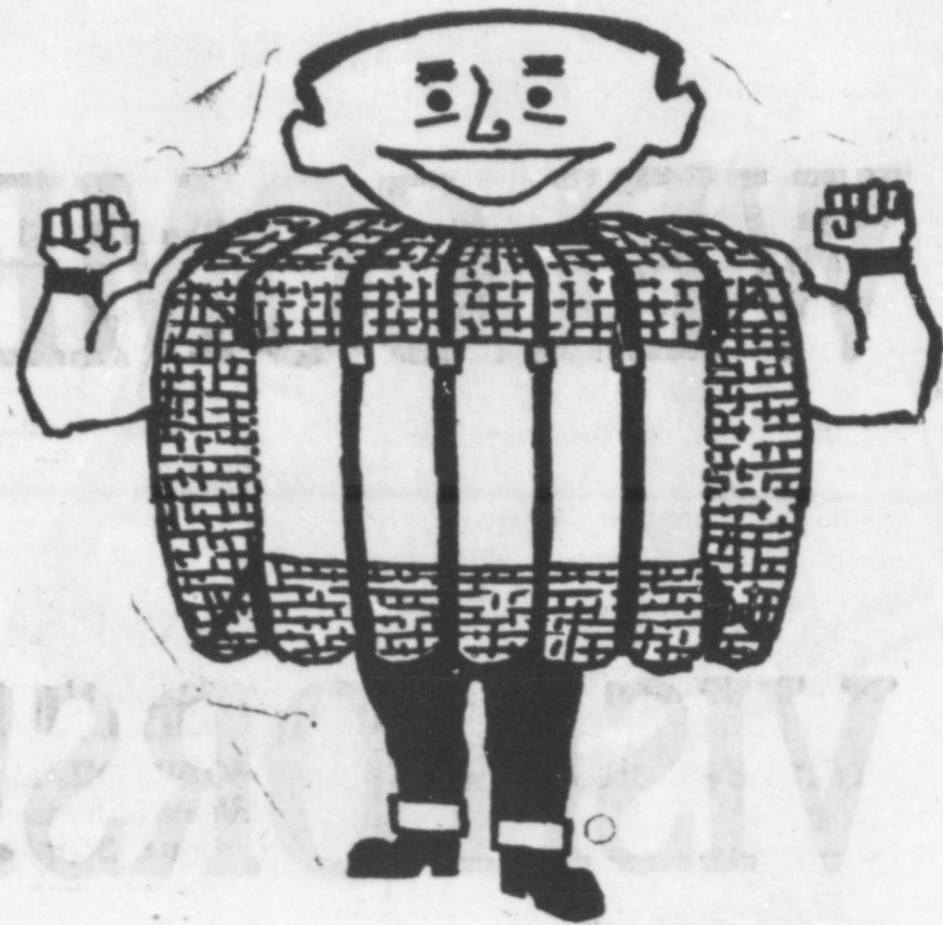

Today nearly 400,000 men and women serve as volunteer leaders, using their special skills to guide the youngsters. Many of them are parents of 4-H'ers.

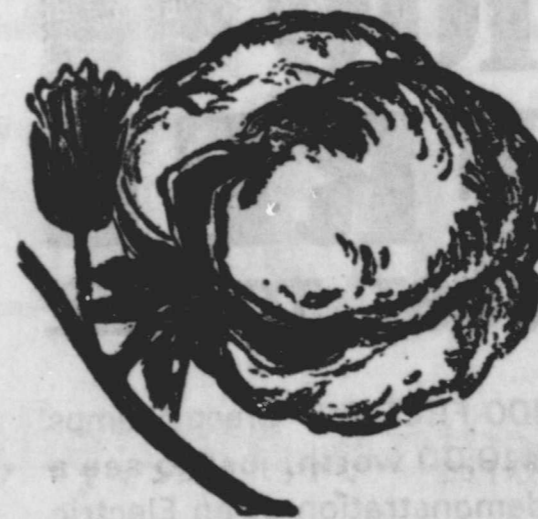



Because of the recent outbreak of rabies in both Donley and Collingsworth Counties, many people are concerned about vaccinating their dogs and cats.

The local FFA chapter will help with the vaccinating of these animals. Those interested in such help should let any of the FFA boys or Mr. Messer know of their needs.

Skunks are the most likely carriers of rabies. Through the destruction of these animals and consistent use of vaccine for pets, rabies can be controlled.



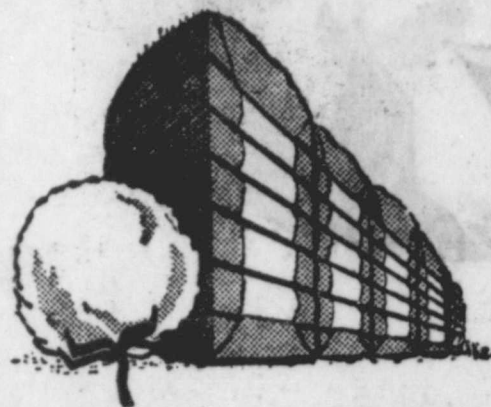
