#### **Amendments**

Texas voters will have six constitutional amendments to vote on Nov 11. A brief outline of the proposed amendments is as follows:

Amendment No. 1 authorizes counties to put all county tax rev enue into one general fund without regard to source or purpose.

Amendment No 2 permits municipalities, political subdivisions and state supported entities located within a hospital district to participate in the establishment and operation of mental health mental retardation and public health services

Amendment No. 3 extends the veterans land program by authorizing the sale of \$200 million of state bonds to purchase land to be sold to veterans and expands the program to include veterans of Viet Nam

Amendment No 4 authorizes counties to pay medical, doctor, and hospital bills of county law enforcement officers for injuries received in line of duty and to continue to pay salaries of injured officials during period of incapacitation

Amendment No 5 authorizes the Parks and Wildlife Dept. to issue and sell general obligation bonds in the amount of \$75 million to finance acquisition and development of lands for state parks and recreational purposes.

Amendment No. 6 permits nonelective state officers and employees to serve in other non-elective positions under the state or United States government where there is no conflict of interest and where the state will benefit
