## Cotton Report

Memphis, Nov. 3-Although cotton harvesting has been slow, it came to a standstill this week due to high winds, blowing sand, light rain and light snow, according to K E Voelkel, in charge of the USDA's cotton classing office in Memphis It was estimated that 75 percent to 85 percest of the cotton was open, but that farmere were waiting for a killing frost, which oecurred in some lowlying areas this morning.
Sample receipts were sufficient last week to keep two classing tables busy tnis week Through Friday, November 3, a seasonal total of 8,000 samples have been classed compared with 1500 as of the same date last year.
