Cotton Report

Memphis, Nov. 3—Although cotton harvesting has been slow, it came to a standstill this week due to high winds, blowing sand, light rain and light snow, according to K. E. Voelkel, in charge of the USDA's cotton classing office in Memphis. It was estimated that 75 percent to 85 percent of the cotton was open, but that farmers were waiting for a killing frost, which occurred in some low-lying areas this morning.

Sample receipts were sufficient last week to keep two classing tables busy this week. Through Friday, November 3, a seasonal total of 8,000 samples have been classed compared with 1500 as of the same date last year.
