Cotton Report

The Golden Spread cotton harvest came to an abrupt halt when a mixture of sleet, snow and light rain fell late Monday and Monday night according to K. E. Voelkel of the U. S. D. A.'s Cotton Classing Office in Memphis. The backlog of unginned cotton on gin yards permitted samples to be received at a steady rate in spite of the damp weather. With the number of unclassified samples on hand it will be the middle of next week before it can be determined the effect the weather had, if any, on the harvested cotton since the inclement weather set in.

Voelkel stated that the 8 classing tables in operation, which is full capacity, processed 21,000 samples this week for a seasonal total of 66,000. This compared with 51,000 classed as of Dec 1, 1966. It was estimated that about 45 percent of the crop in this area had been classed.

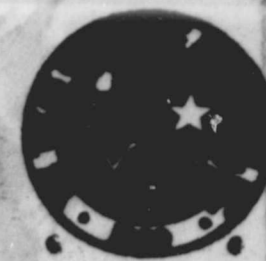

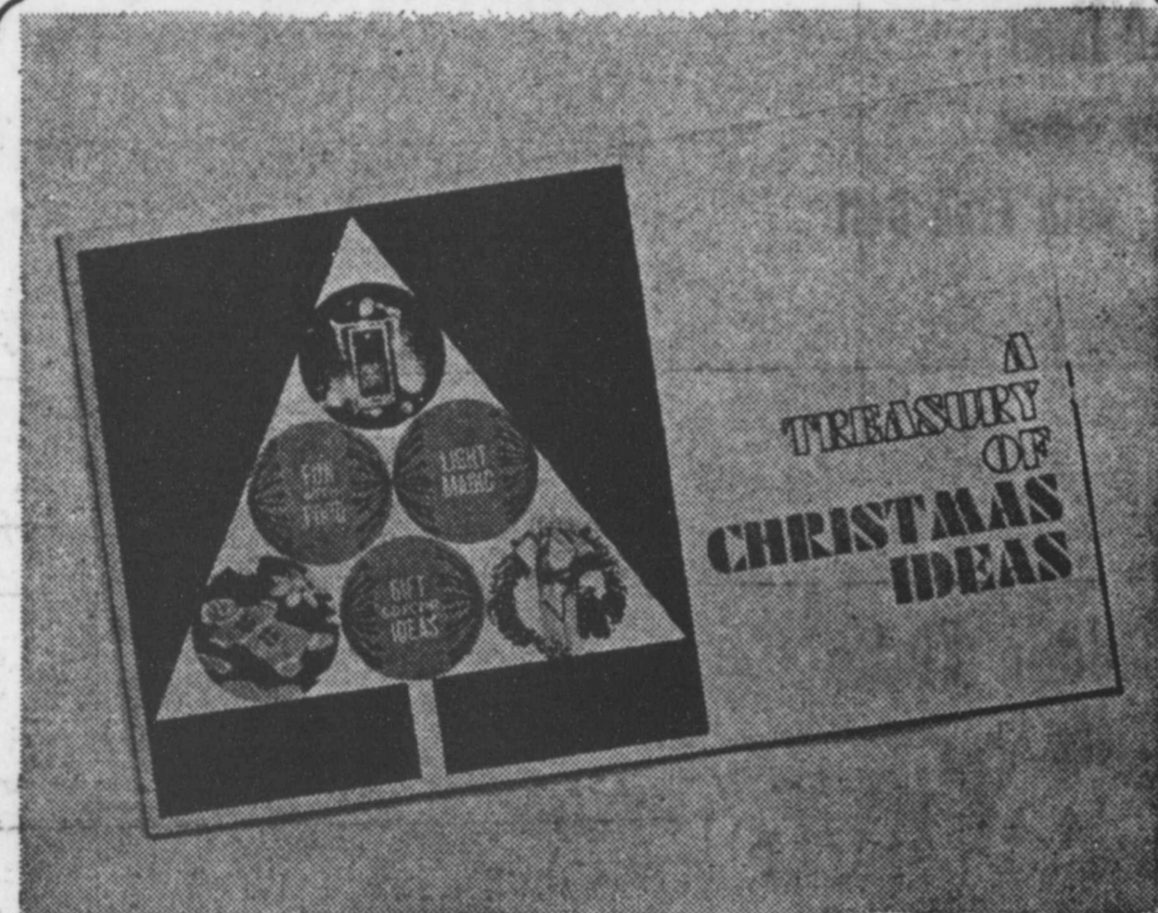
Register To Vote
