## Bank Balance and Loan Verification

Banking Commissioner J. M. Falkner has announced that the Texas Banking Department is expanding its normal routine examination procedures to include program of direct verification of deposit and loan balances in Statechartered banks in Texas. He said that during future examinations Examiner personnel will mail verification forms to bank cus tomers whose accounts are selected on a random sampling basis The forms will request the customer to verify the deposit or loan balance indicated, to indieate any diserepancies which might be noted, and to return the form to the Banking Department In the event of differences or discrepancie, further contact with the customer will be made.
As well as being a means of dicovery of bank employee error or misappropriation, verification pro grams provide a paycological deterrent against defalcatione
