

Farmers and cattlemen are acquiring needed land resources by forming grazing associations and obtaining financial assistance from the Farmers Home Administration, the agency's Donley County Supervisor, Claude Moore, has an nounced.

A grazing association is composed of a group of family farmers and rauchers who join together to acquire and develop land to provide seasonal grazing for livestock belonging to its members

Eligible to form associations are neighboring farmers and ranchers who operate family size units Financial and technical assistance is provided by the Farmers Home Administration

Loans are available to qualified borrowers for periods up to 40 years at an interest rate of 5 percent. Interested individuals should contact Claude Moore, County Supervisor, at the Agriculture Building in Clarendon form a steering committee, and begin looking for suitable acreaze.





Sept. 11th to see for themselves how the false impression and sense of security that a driver of a modern automobile gets, can and does, often lead into the danger zone and trouble, when they participate in a series of driving tests R D. Reynolds principal announced

The tests, which will be in two parts, will be given under the direction of Ben Bullard, Assistant Safety Director, Texas Farm Bureau.

The first section will be a short talk and film on traffic safety, while the second will be a demonstration on Third Street south of the school

High point of the demonstration will come when driving tests are made with various students and faculty members in the specially equipped car An electric detonator which is mounted on the front bumper of the car, will fire yellow paint bullets to indicate the distance required to stop the car in an emergency.


