## Vehicle Inspection

The 1969 vehicle inspection period began Sept 1, according to Colonel Wilson E. (Pat) Speir, acting director of the Texas Dept. of Public Safety.

More than six million vehicles are expected to receive the compulsory inspection prior to the April 15, 1969, deadline, Speir said.

The minimum fee is \$1.75. This does not include the cost of repairs or adjustments necessary to enable the vehicle to pass inspection.

Motorists are urged to have the 1969 inspection performed as soon as possible to insure that their vehicles are mechanically safe for fall and winter driving.

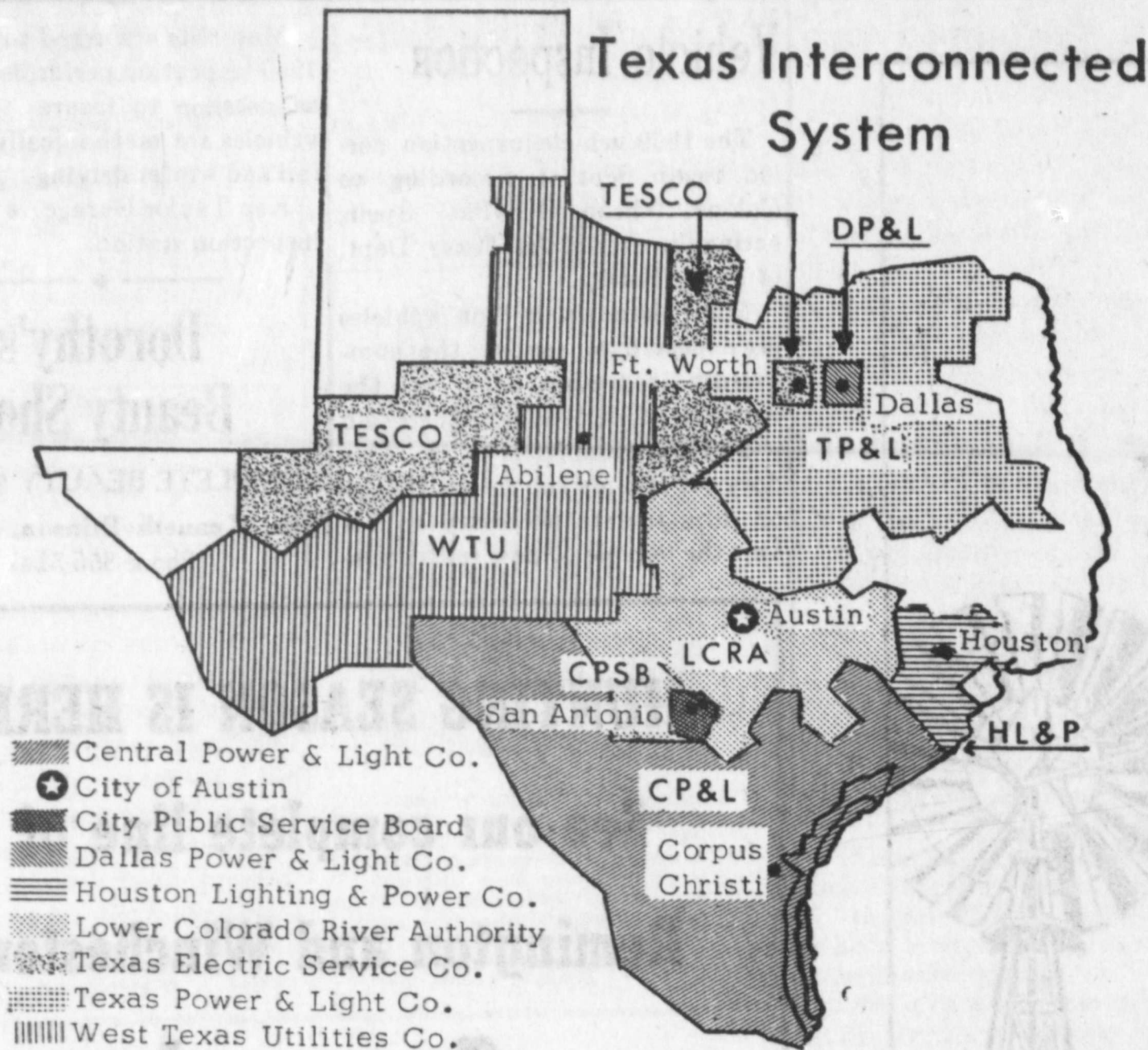

For more than 25 years, WTU and eight partners in power have operated in harmony to provide a highly dependable power supply for Texas.

It is nice to have neighbors you can depend on, and electrical company people long ago discovered that the "good neighbor policy"

works out well in business. That is the simple principle behind the Texas Interconnected System, a network composed of nine major power systems in Texas. Whenever trouble occurs on one electric system, that system can instantly borrow power from neighbors, other members of the TIS.

The Texas Interconnected System is composed of West Texas Utilities Co and eight other power systems which operate wholly within the State of Texas. In a state as large as Texas, with great variations in climate and geography, the membership of the TIS is divided into two groups to simplify operations: The North Texas Interconnected Systems (NTIS) and the South Texas Interconnected Systems (STIS). In the NTIS are Dallas Power & Light Company, Texas Power & Light Company, Texas Electric Service Company and West Texas Utilities Company, all investor owned electric companies.

The STIS is composed of two investor-owned companies Houston Lighting & Power Company and Central Power & Light Company; two municipal power systems, the City of Austin and the City Public Service Board of San Antonio; and one state authority, the Lower Colorado River Authority.

The purpose of TIS is to continue to insure a reliable supply of power to about 8,000,000 people served by the nine member electric utilities. It maintains an ample supply of what is called "spinning reserve" which is spare generating capacity in operation and on the system ready to take on load instantly.

**Water Rate Increased**

Due to demands by the Texas Water Development Board, the Greenbelt Water Authority has drastically raised the rate for water to the member cities, forcing each city to make a much larger charge for water than heretofore.

The rates for the City of Hedley were set at \$6.00 for the minimum of 2,000 gallons, and \$1.00 per 1,000 gallons thereafter up to 40,000 gallons, and 90¢ per 1,000 for all over that amount.

This price increase will be on your bill for September, which you will receive Oct. 1st.

This is the project for which Hedley voted 188 to 0.
