Transfer of 1969 Cotton Allotments

The final date to file an application for the transfer of 1969 cotton allotments is Dec. 31, 1968. A cotton producer may transfer his allotment by sale or lease within the county. Transfer by sale or lease may be made from farms in other counties to Donley County, or transferred by a farm owner to another farm owned or controlled by him within the State. Transfers by sale or lease may not be made out of Donley County.

1969 Cotton Marketing Quota Referendum

The referendum will be held during the period Dec. 2 through Dec. 6. Voting will be by mail and ballots and instructions will be mailed to each known eligible voter prior to Dec. 2. Notices of allotments and yields will also be mailed to all producers prior to the referendum.

If quotas are approved by at least two-thirds of the upland cotton growers voting, the program under which payments are made to cooperators will be in effect for 1969.

All the program details of the upland cotton program will not be announced until sometime after the Nov. 8 crop report of the Agriculture Department.

The Texas Highway Patrol investigated four accidents on rural highways in Donley County during the month of October, according to Sergeant J. L. Dalrymple, Highway Patrol Supervisor of this area.

These crashes resulted in one person injured and an estimated property damage of \$1,045.

The rural traffic accident summary for this county during the first ten months of 1968 shows a total of 50 accidents resulting in 3 persons killed, 35 persons injured, and an estimated property damage of \$108,286.

Commodity Loans

Growers are cheating themselves if they market their crops at prices below the CCC loan rate levels. The price support-loan program was developed as a means of helping farmers sell their crops at a time when market conditions are most favorable, and that time normally is not at harvest time when supplies are ample and prices are likely to be down. Government loan gives an immediate return to the participating farmer at harvest time, and at the same time the farmer retains control of his crop. By storing it for a while and then repaying the loan and selling the crop later after the marketing peak, the grower frequently can get a much better price.


Wheat Program

The 1969 wheat program calls for a 15 percent diversion of acres on the farm. The 15 percent is not taken off the allotment, but an acreage equal to 15 percent must be diverted somewhere on the farm.
