Bull Sale

Transfer of 1969 Cotton Allotmente

The final date to file an application for the transfer of 1969 cotton allotments is Dec. 31, 1968 A cotton producer may transfer his allotment by sale or lease within the county. Transfer by sale or lease may be made from farms in other counties to Dopley County. or transferred by a farm owner to another farm owned or controlled by him within the State. Transfers by sale or lease may not be made out of Donley County 1969 Cotton Marketing Quota Referendum

The referendum will be held during the period Dec 2 through Dec 6 Voting will be by mail and ballots and instructions will be mailed to each known eligible voter prior to Dec 2 Notices of allotments and yields will also be mailed to all producers prior to the referendum.

If quotas are approved by at least two-thirds of the upland cotton growers voting, the program under which payments are made to cooperators will be in effect for 1969.

All the program details of the upland cotton program will not be Sodalitas Club announced until sometime after the Nov 8 crop report of the Agriculture Department.

for a 15 percent diversion of acres on the form. The 15 percent is not taken off the allotment, but an acreage equal to 15 percent must be diverted somewhere on








