Efficiency, Not Fancy In Donley Co. Feedlot

Charles Payne has announced that progress is still going full swing on the construction of Donley County Feedlot. Automatic water troughs have arrived from Denver, Colo., that will be used in the feeding pens. These water troughs are heated by electricity in the winter time to keep the water at a more desirable temperature for the cattle. The temperature is controlled by a thermostat that will maintain a desirable temperature even in the coldest weather. This will maintain a higher gain per day and also an increase in feed efficiency.

Charles Payne stated that a water well had been drilled and a desirable amount of good water has been found. The well consists of about 50 feet of water sand which will provide an abundance of water for several hundred head of cattle under extreme heat conditions.

Concrete aprons have been put in for cattle to stand on while eating. Bunk feeders are now being installed. The cattle will be fed twice daily. Some trials will be run on feeding cattle 3 times a day to see if we can find an economical increase in gain. It will depend on the results of these tests whether the cattle can be economically fed 3 times a day and increase net profits or just the usual twice a day.

Various equipment that will be used in processing the feed has been ordered from Kansas City and is expected to arrive any day. Other equipment has been ordered from different concerns and will be here soon.

I have set up various goals to be obtained in the feedlot operation. This feedlot will not be a fancy feedlot, but will be one of efficiency. This is very important in a feedlot becoming established, is the efficiency with which it can operate. All details must be watched with care to keep overhead down, yet do a good job for the customers.

I still plan on being finished with the majority of the construction by Jan. 1st. We are trying to finish the feeding pens that we have started. As soon as the feeding pens are finished and the mixing system complete we will be ready to feed cattle. As soon as

Transfer of 1969 Cotton Allotments

The final date to file an application for the transfer of 1969 cotton allotments is Dec. 31, 1968. A cotton producer may transfer his allotment by sale or lease within the county. Transfer by sale or lease may be made from farms in other counties to Donley County, or transferred by a farm owner to another farm owned or controlled by him within the State. Transfers by sale or lease may not be made out of Donley County.



1969 Cotton Marketing Quota Referendum

The referendum will be held during the period Dec 2 through Dec 6. Voting will be by mail and ballots and instructions will be mailed to each known eligible voter prior to Dec 2. Notices of allotments and yields will also be mailed to all producers prior to the referendum.

If quotas are approved by at least two thirds of the upland cotton growers voting, the program under which payments are made to cooperators will be in effect for 1969.

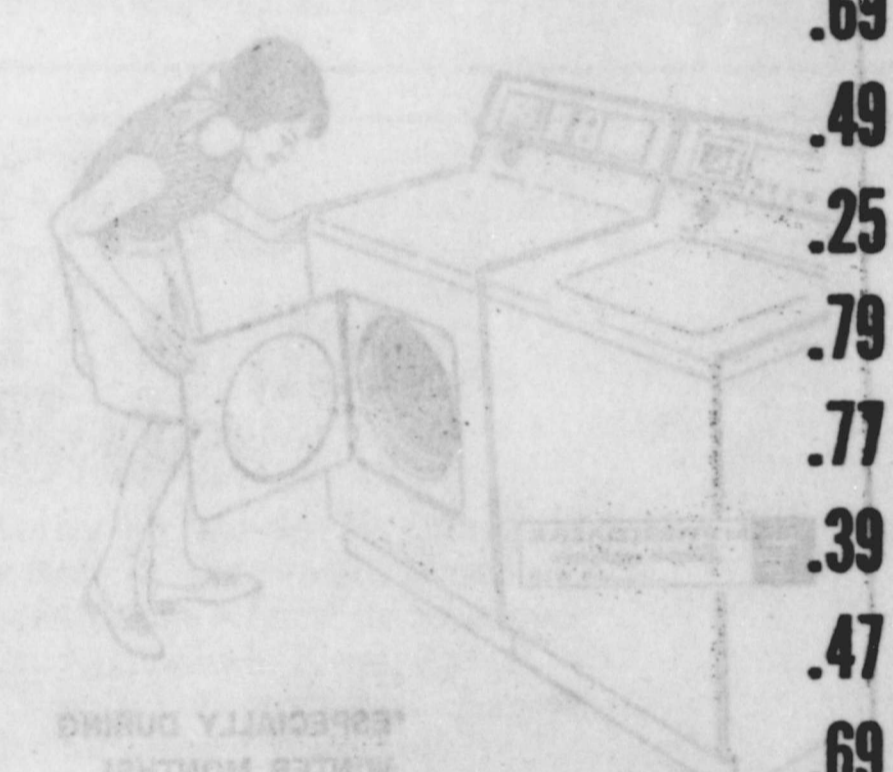

Commodity Loans

Growers are cheating themselves if they market their crops at prices below the CCC loan rate levels. The price support loan program was developed as a means of helping farmers sell their crops at a time when market conditions are most favorable, and that time normally is not at harvest time when supplies are ample and prices are likely to be down. Government loan gives an immediate return to the participating farmer at harvest time, and at the same time the farmer retains control of his crop. By storing it for a while and then repaying the loan and selling the crop later after the marketing peak, the grower frequently can get a much better price.

Wheat Program

The 1969 wheat program calls for a 15 percent diversion of acres

on the farm. The 15 percent is not taken off the allotment, but an acreage equal to 15 percent must be diverted somewhere on the farm.

Dangerous Corners

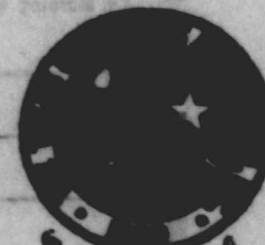
