#### 1969 Wheat

In order to participate in the 1969 wheat program, you must certify compliance with the program and divert an acreage equal to 15 percent of your 1969 allotment. Some producers are confused about this as they think this 15 percent comes off of the original wheat allotment. But remember, you can plant all of your allotment and set aside the 15 percent diversion. This will entitle you to earn certificate payments on 43 percent of your allotment plus an opportunity to divert an additional amount for payment.

### Proposed Public School Changes

Many people in Texas are quite shaken up by the drastic changes proposed by the Governor's Committee on Public School Education. The worst change is that of making each school have a minimum of 2,600 students, or else a county-wide school district.

No doubt the members of this committee mean well, but they are all from cities, and have no idea of rural problems or of the fatal impact on small towns of the loss of their schools.

It is claimed that students would benefit from a wider variety of subjects offered in larger schools, but any such possible benefit is much more than offset by the disadvantages of having long bus rides, of a less personal relationship between teacher and pupil, of decreased opportunities for activities and leadership, and less time to spend at home.

Certainly Hedley High School can point to a gratifying number of graduates who have made excellent records after their student days here. They are graduates of whom any school could be proud, and the quality of their instruction has obviously not been inferior.

If you wish to protest this committee's proposal, you should write to Governor Preston Smith, Lieut. Governor Ben Barnes, State Senator Grady Hazelwood or State Representative Tom Christian. Individual letters are much better than petitions.

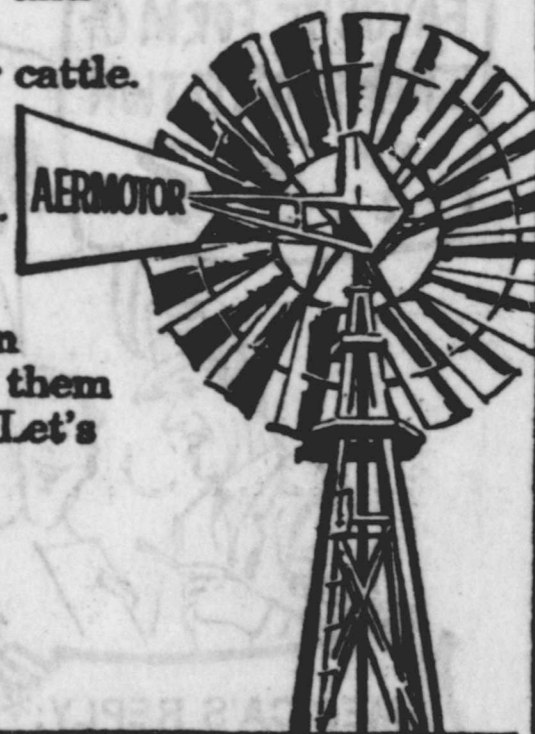


