## PUBLIC NOTICE Proposed CONSTITUTIONAL AMENDMENT NUMBER EIGHT ON THE BALLOT (HJR50)

BE IT RESOLVED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS: Section 1. That Article III, Constitution of the State of Texas, be amended by adding a new Section 50b-1 to read as follows: "Section 50b-1 (a) The Lega

follows: "Section 50b-1. (a) The Leg-islature may provide that the Coordinating Board, Texas College and University Sys-tem, or its successor or suc-cessors, shall have authority to provide for, issue and sell gen-eral obligation bonds of the State of Texas in an amount not to exceed Two Hundred Million Dollars (\$200,000,000) in addition to those heretofore authorized to be issued pur-suant to Section 50b of the Constitution. The bonds auth-orized herein shall be executed in such form, upon such terms

orized herein shall be executed in such form, upon such terms and be in such denomination as may be prescribed by law and shall bear interest, and be issued in such installments as shall be prescribed by the Board provided that the max-imum net effective interest rate to be borne by such bonds may be fixed by law. "(b) The moneys received from the sale of such bonds shall be deposited to the credit of the Texas Opportunity Plan Fund created by Section 50b of the Constitution and shall otherwise be handled as pro-vided in Section 50b of the


