A new superintendent has been chosen for the Hedley schools for the coming year. He is John Garlon Freeman, who is coming here from Center, Colorado.

Mr Freeman received his B S degree from Sul Ross College at Alpine in 1950, and his M. of Ed. degree from Texas Tech in 1952. He has had 18 years of experience in the Texas public schools 12 years as a teacher and 6 years as a superintendent. Water Rates Lowered To Wed June 13

Due to a change in rates by the Greenbelt Water Authority, new water rates to encourage more water use have been set by the Hedley City Council.

The minimum will remain at \$6 00 for 2,000 gallons. The next 10,000 gallons will cost 50¢ per thousand, the next 10,000 gallons will cost 40¢ per thousand, and all over 22,000 gallons will cost 30¢ per thousand. This is much cheaper than the previous price for water over the minimum.

The City Council is attempting to hold the water minimum down, but it should be kept in mind that the city will now have a minimum monthly payment to meet, and everyone should try to use as much water as possible. If enough water is used, the minimum will not need to be raised.

These rates go into effect immediately, and will be shown on the water bill you receive July 1st.

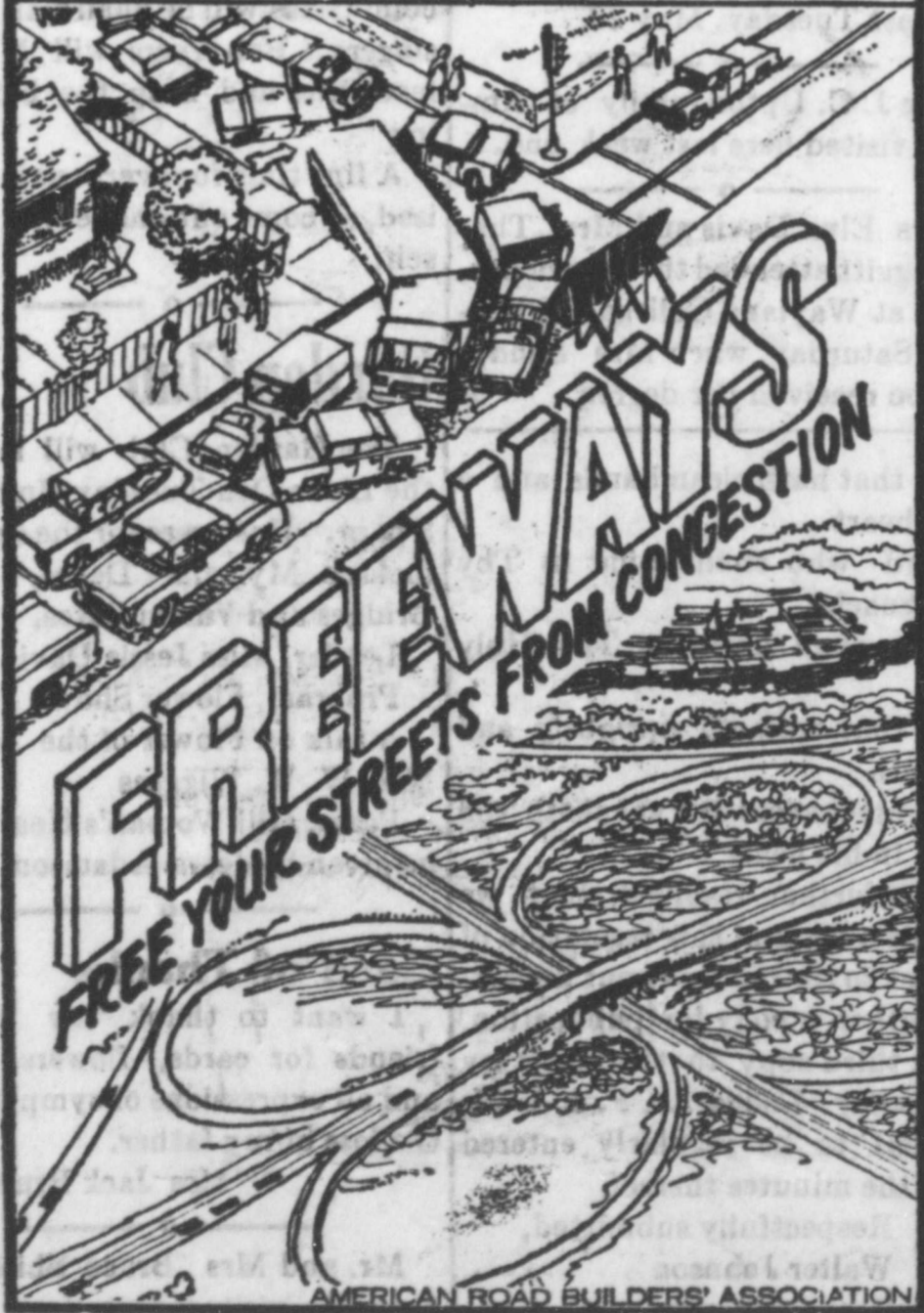

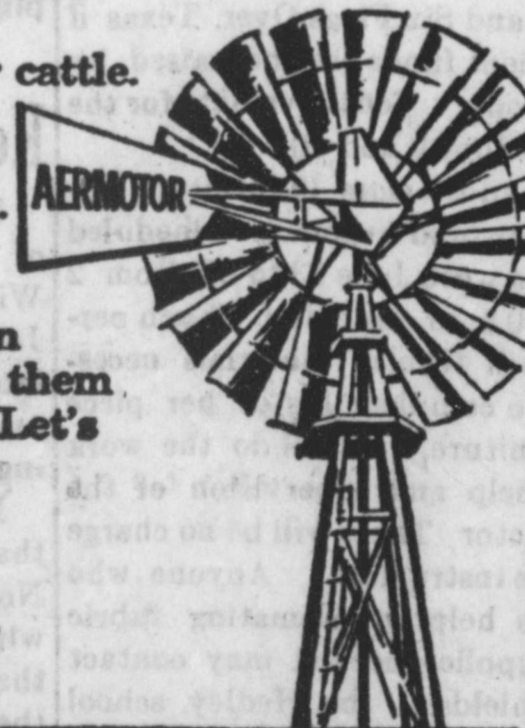

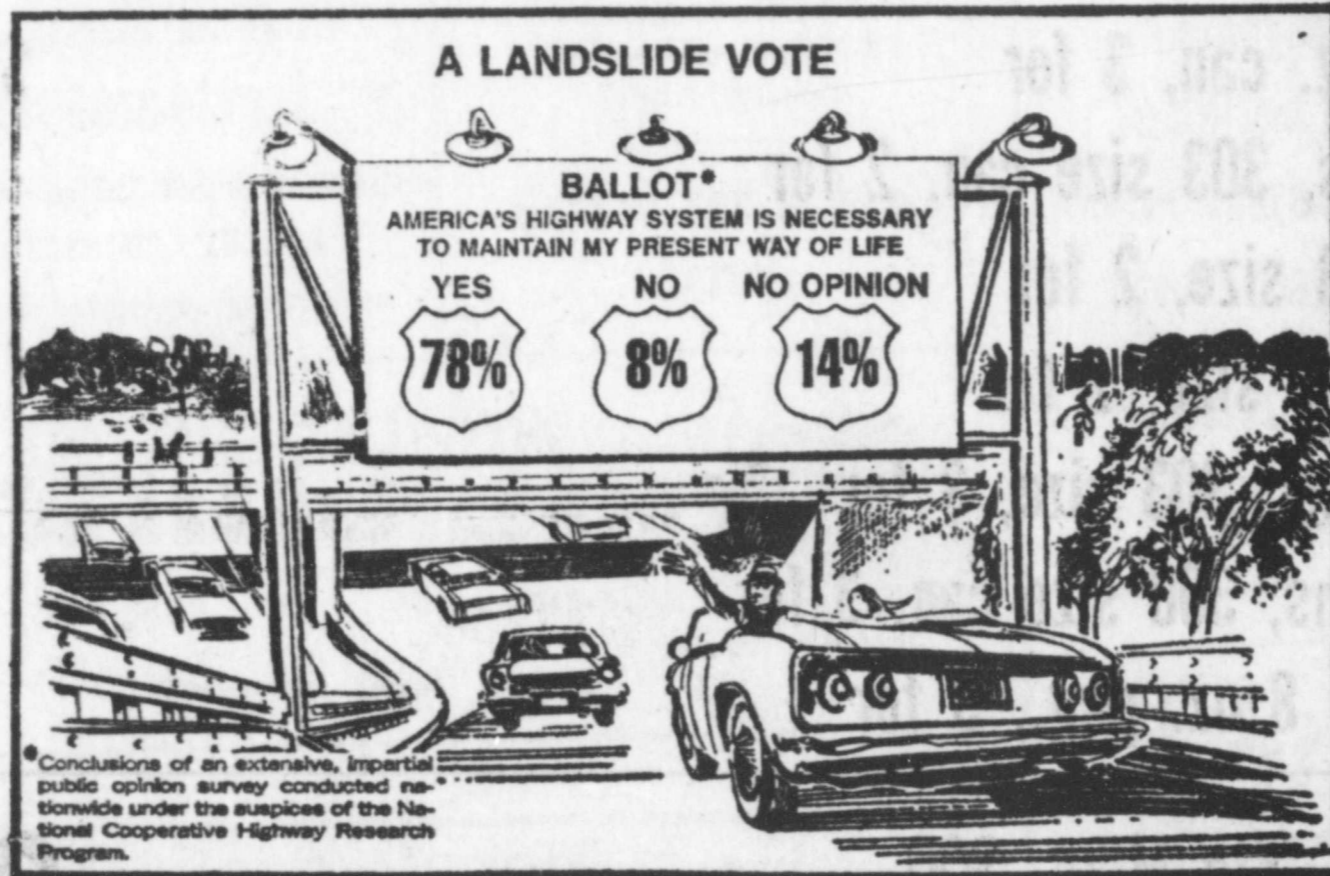
