Quail Season

The Quail season in the Panhandle Regulatory District will be from Nov 8 through Jan 31, except in the counties of Briscoe, Childress, Cottle, Hall and Motley, where the season will be from Dec 1 through Jan 31.

The daily bag limit will be 12 per day, and 36 in possession.

If you don't know about the new income tax form, you will shortly after Jan. 1. Internal Revenue Service has issued a fact sheet on the new form 1040. Here are some of the facts.

The new 1040 not only replaces the card form 1040A, but also the old 1040 form. The new form is a one page basic form to which schedules can be added to cover any tax situation. IRS says that 77 million returns will be filed for this year-1969. An estimated 31 million will use only one page. Another 22 million returns will consist of the new one page form and one additional attachment. Thus, about 75% of all the 1969 income tax returns will require only one or two pages.
