## New Tax Form

If you don't know about the new income tax form, you will shortly after Jan 1. Internal Revenue Service has issued a fact sheet on the new form 1040. Here are some of the facts

The new 1040 not only replaces the card form 1040A, but also the old 1040 form. The new form is a one page basic form to which

schedules can be added to cover any tax situation. IRS says that 77 million returns will be filed for this year—1969. An estimated 31 million will use only one page. Another 22 million returns will consist of the new one page form and one additional attachment. Thus, about 75% of all the 1969 income tax returns will require only one or two pages.

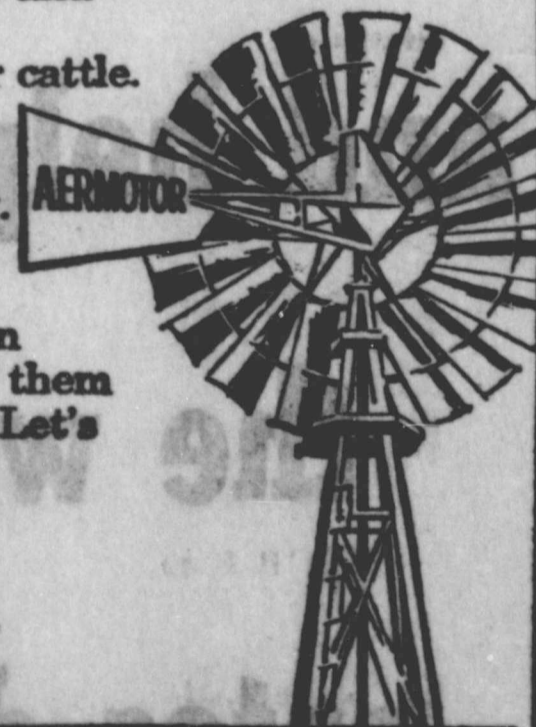

## Accident Report

The Texas Highway Patrol investigated six accidents on rural highways in Donley County during the month of October according to Sergeant Vernon Cawthon, Highway Patrol Supervisor of this area.

These crashes resulted in no persons killed, four persons injured and an estimated property damage of \$8550.

The rural accident summary for this county during the first ten months of 1969 shows a total of 41 accidents resulting in no persons killed, 29 persons injured, and an estimated property damage of \$32,936.

## Vehicle Inspection

Austin—Colonel Wilson E. Speir, director of the Texas Department of Public Safety, said today that motor vehicle inspections in Texas are running almost 30% behind the inspection rate at this time last year.

"Unless the inspections rate increases, there are going to be some awfully long lines at inspection stations prior to the April 15 deadline," Speir said.

During the year which ended Aug 31, some 63 million vehicles were inspected in Texas. Since Sept 1, only 538,000 have received the required inspection.
