## West Texas Uubilities Sets Safety Record

A new all-time safety record we set on December 31 when the em. ployees of West Texas Utilities Co. completed the year without a lost-time accident.
During the twelve month peried WTU's 1040 employees worked a total of $\mathbf{2} \mathbf{2 2 1 , 6 7 4} \mathrm{man}$ hours.
During its long bistory of pro viding electric service to customers in West Texas, never before bas such a record been achieved Several times during the past 10 years the perfect record was almost reached. In 1960 only two lost-time accidents were recorded. Three were charged to the Com-
pany's record in 1963; four in 1964; and only two in 1967 Since 1957 only 57 lost-time accidents have been recorded in the 10 -year period:
Last September the WTU employees received special recogoition when they were presented the Safety Achiewement A ward by the Bureau of Safety This came after they had worked more than $2,000,000 \mathrm{man}$ hours without a loat-time accident. The latt recorded was in October, 1968. The record now reads: fourteen months without a lost-time accioent.
