They will play Quail in the district tournament at Clarendon Thursday at 6:00, and Samnorwood girls will play Lakeview at 7:30. The two winners will play at 7:00 Friday night for the championship of the tournament. If the Hedley girls win the district tournament, there will be no playoff, but if they should lose the tournament, there will be a playoff Saturday night.

Samnorwood boys defeated Lakeview last Friday night, leaving all four boys teams in the district tied with 3-3 records.

In the round robin playoffs at Wellington Monday night, the Hedley boys defeated Quail 69 to 54. David Bolin was high for Hedley with 23 points. Lakeview defeated Samnorwood 59 to 43, so that Hedley and Lakeview were scheduled to play the finals Tuesday night at Wellington.

The first and fourth winners of the boys will play at 9:00 Thursday night at Clarendon, and the second and third winners will play Friday night at 8:30.

The championship game will be Saturday night.

We are now accepting applications for needed conservation practices. Remember, to be eligible for cost-shares a producer must sign a request for assistance before work is started on the practice.

If you have made application for listing or chiseling cotton land,

you must complete and report the practice by Feb 16. This is positively the last date, no extension in time will be given for this practice.

Producers are responsible for certifying the acreages on ACP practices as well as other programs and are subject to spot check. If reports are not within the allowable tolerance, payment can be withheld on the entire practice.

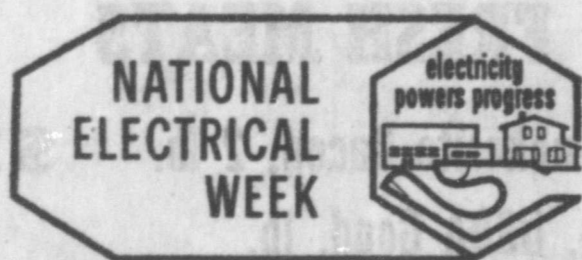

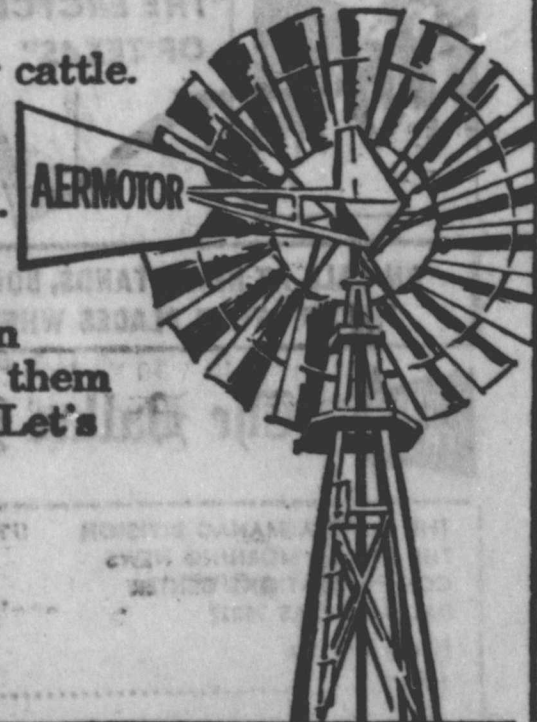
