Report Of Program Sign Up

As of March 13, 427 cotton farms are enrolled, 394 feed grain farms, and 178 wheat farms. This is approximately 75% of the farms in the county. Reminders have been mailed to producers who have not signed up March 20 is the late date.

Release And Reapportionment Of Cotton

200 acres of cotton have been released for reapportionment. This will be done March 30.

Grazing Privileges On Diverted Acres May Be Modified

Announcement has been made that grazing privileges may be modified on cropland taken out of production and designated as diverted acres under the 1970 Programs. This is the second year USDA has taken such action to enable additional grazing of spring forage. The additional optional non-grazing period would run between May 14 and Oct 15 permitting spring grazing two weeks later than possible under prior programs.

According to Sunday's Amarillo News 1336 votes were cast in the hospital election last Saturday, out of some 2200 registered voters in the county.

It was voted, 809 to 549, to create a hospital district over the entire county. It was also voted, 756 to 529, to approve the bond issue to finance construction of a 50 bed hospital.

Accident Report

The Texas Highway Patrol investigated one accident on rural highways in Donley County during the month of February, according to Sergeant Vernon Cawthon, Highway Patrol Supervisor of this area.

This crash resulted in an estimated property damage of \$255.

The rural accident summary for this county during the first two months of 1970 shows a total of six accidents resulting in one person killed, one person injured, and an estimated property damage of \$7,405

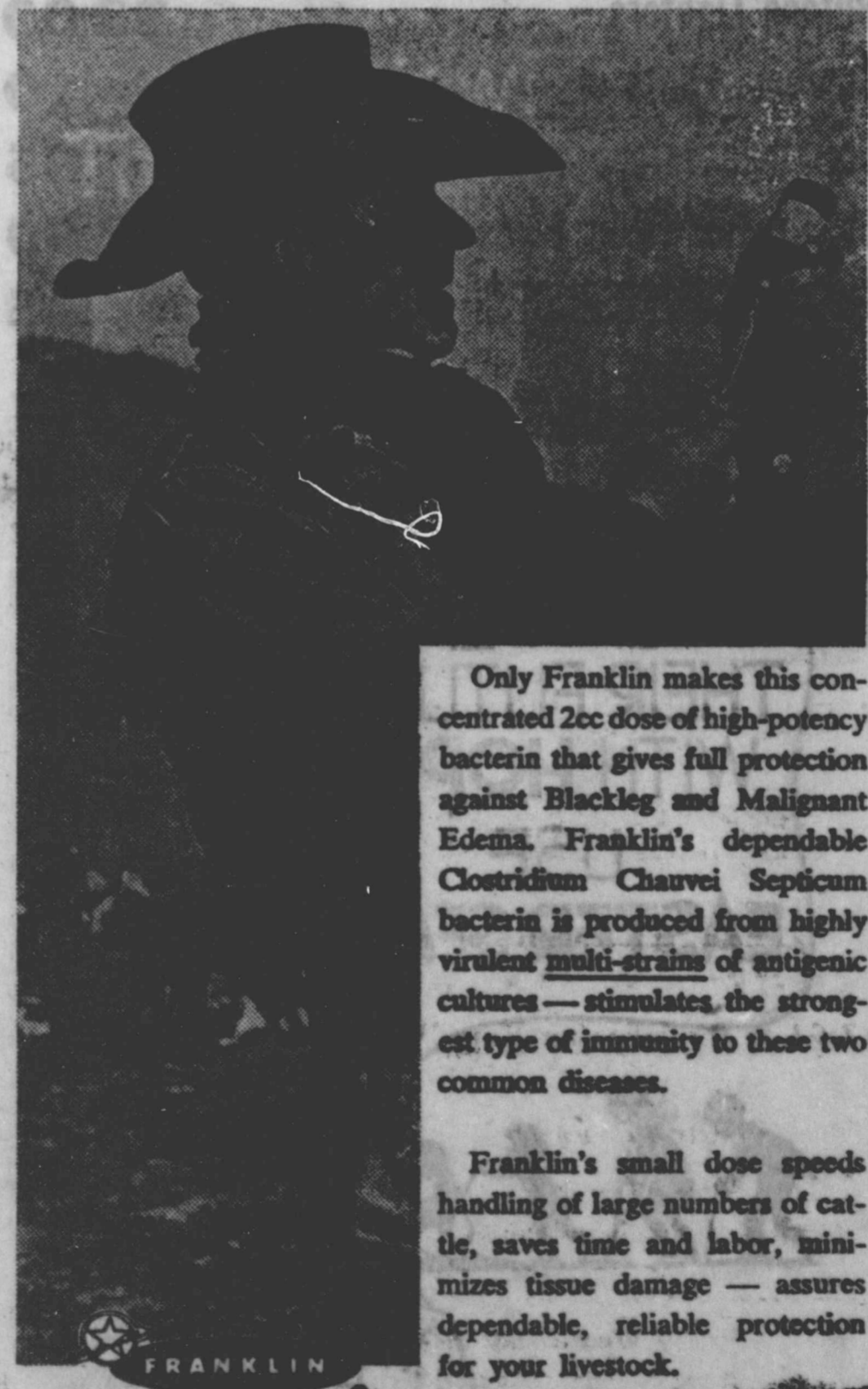

Notice Affording Opportunity For Public Hearing Corridor (Location) and Design (Combined Hearing)

The Texas Highway Department is planning the construction of Farm to Market Road 1260, from End of F. M. Road 1260, 5.0 Miles North of U. S. Highway 287, East and North 5.0 Miles.

The proposed design will provide a 20-foot surface, and 28-foot crown width, with a 26-foot roadway width bridge on the Salt Fork of Red River. The right of way width on the proposed project will be a minimum of 100 feet.

Maps and other drawings showing the proposed location and geometric design and any other information about the proposed project are on file and available for inspection and copying at the Resident Engineer's office at Clarendon, Texas. Also, the drawings showing the proposed geometric design have been placed on file in the office of the County Judge of Donley County.

Information about the State's Relocation Assistance Program, the benefits and services for displacees and the relocation assistance office, as well as information about the tentative schedules for acquisition of right of way and construction can be obtained at the Texas Highway Department District Office, P. O. Box 909, Childress, Texas, 79201.

Any interested person may request that a public hearing be held covering the social, economic, and environmental effects of the proposed location and design for this highway project by delivering a written request to the office of the Resident Engineer, Clarendon, Texas, or to Mr. V. J. McGee, District Engineer, Childress, Texas, on or before April 14, 1970.

In the event such a request is received, a public hearing will be scheduled and an adequate notice will be publicized about the date and location of the hearing.
