## Tax Assistance Clinic Little League

A tax assistance clinic for taxpayers who have tornado and storm losses has been scheduled in the Academic Building at Clarendon Junior College at 8:00 p. m. on June 18. The meeting will be conducted by John Sloan, Administrative Officer of the Lubbock Internal Revenue Service Office, and an Internal Revenue Instructor.

Mr. Sloan is coordinating the disaster tax information program throughout the ten county area. Previous tax assistance clinics have been scheduled for Plainview on June 9 and Silverton on June 11.

The purpose of the clinic is to inform taxpayers on what steps to take to claim tax deductions for property damage and losses and how to claim immediate tax benefits for tornado and storm damage.

In the second primary here Saturday, 146 votes were cast.

For state senator, Jack Haslewood received 73 votes and Max Sherman 69.

Sherman carried the county by a vote of 439 to 319 for Haslewood.

Over the district, Sherman received 12,324 votes to 9,024 for Haslewood, and Sherman will face Malouf Abraham of Canadian in the general election in November.

For county judge, Frank Thomas received 73 votes and W. B. Christal 72.

Over the county, Christal was nominated by a vote of 465 to 299 for Thomas, and will face James F. Hayes in the November election.

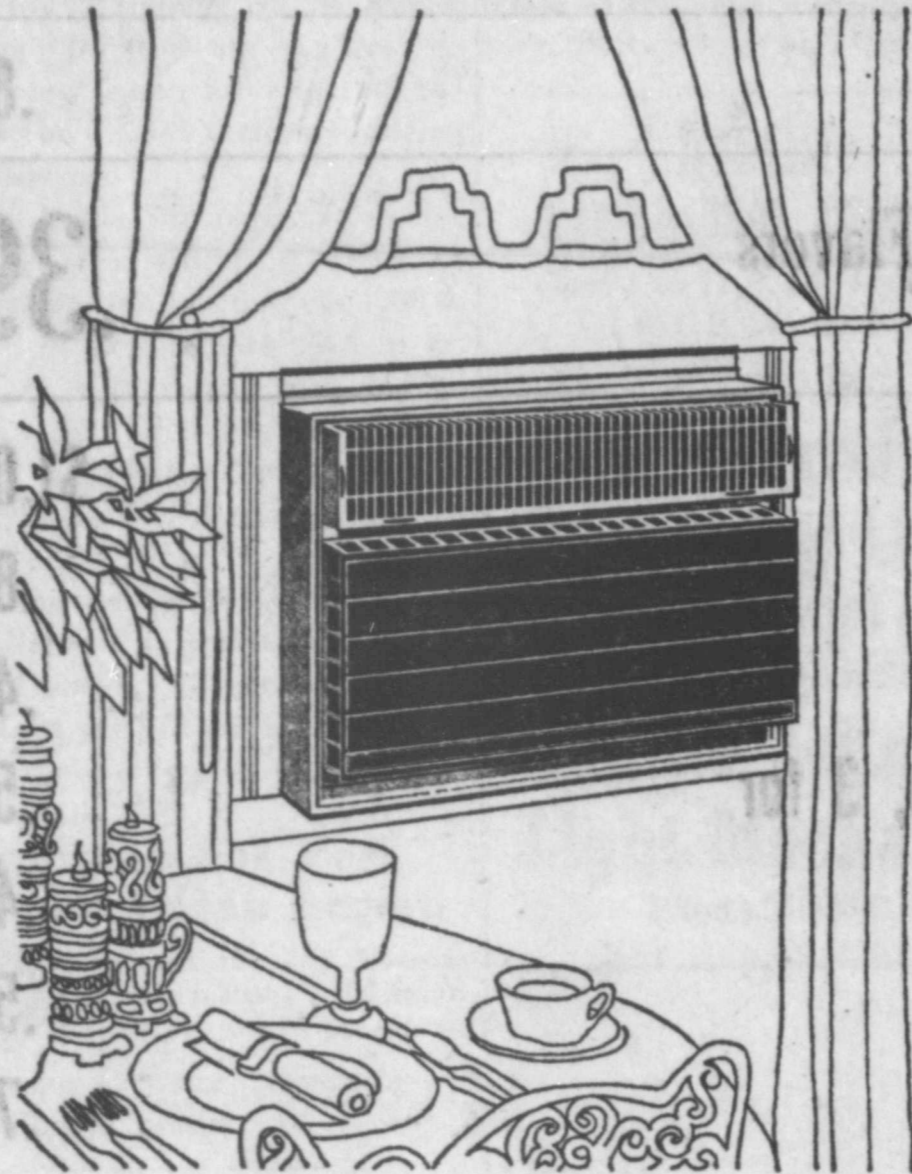

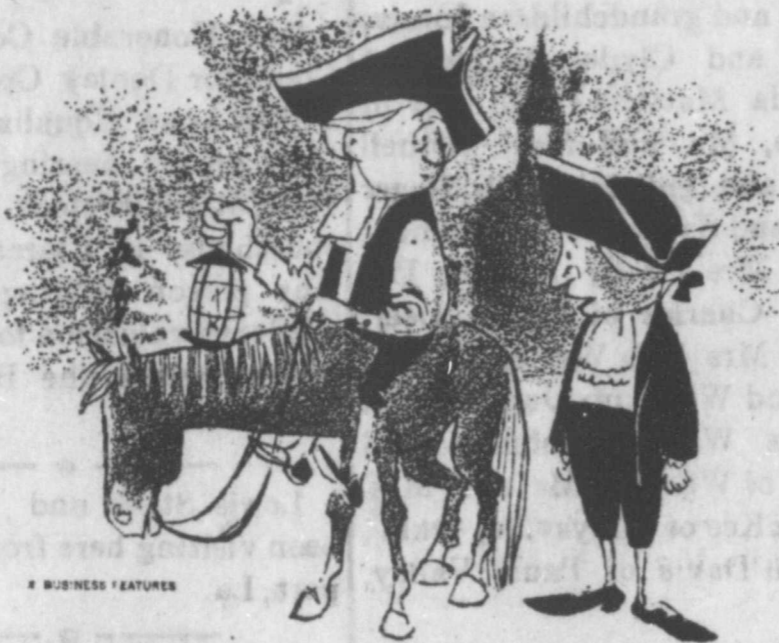

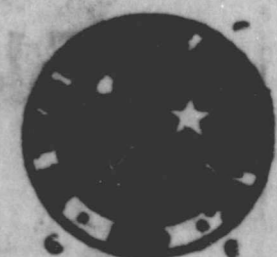
