The Texas Highway Department offered an opportunity for a public hearing to be requested by March 26th, 1970, of a notice reporting the proposed improvement Mr. Burdine, a native of Farm- of F. M. Road 1260, extending 50 miles North of U. S. Highway 287, East and North, in Donley County.

> No requests for a public hearing were received; therefore, the District Office of the Texas Highway Department at Childress, Texas, has submitted all of the engineer ing data and information received in connection with the development of this project for approval of the proposed route and design by the Administration of the Texas Highway Department

The proposed design will provide a 20 foot roadway surface and 28 foot crown width, with a 26 foot roadway width bridge on the Salt Fork of the Red River. The right of way width on the proposed project will be a minimum of 100 feet. There will be no displaced persons or businesses required by this project.

Social Security

Social security benefits paid to residents of Donley County totaled \$65,000 a month as 1969 ended, Travis C. Briggs, social security district manager, reported today.

A benefit increase, signed into law by President Nixon on December 30, 1969, has since raised the monthly rate of payment by 15 percent for the 912 social security beneficiaries in Donley County, Briggs noted.

Of the social security beneficiaries living in Donley County, 638 are retired workers and their dependents Another 182 are receiving benefits as the survivors of workers who have died, and 76 are getting benefits as disabled workers or the dependents of disabled
