The Texas Highway Patrol investigated seven accidents on rural highways in Donley County during the month of June, according to Sergeant Vernon Cawthon, Highway Patrol supervisor of this area.

These crashes resulted in two persons killed, six persons injured, and an estimated property damage of \$3,780.

The rural accident summary for this county during the first six months of 1970 shows a total of twenty-four accidents resulting in three persons killed, eleven persons injured, and an estimated property damage of \$68,365.

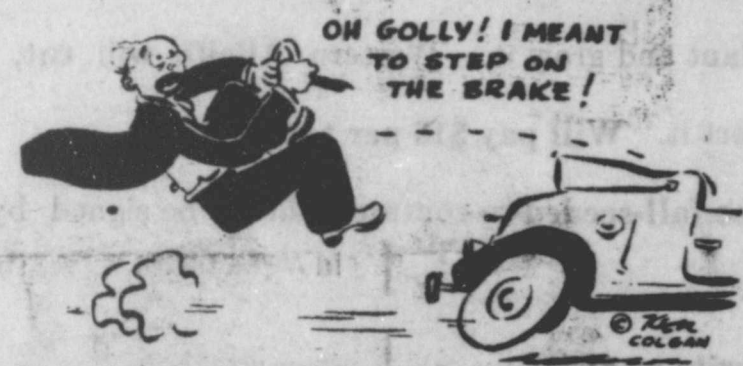
