Rowe Cemetery Could use a Alfalfa Contracts Being Sought

Memphis, Texas-Contracts for a minimum of 5,000 acres of irrigated alfalfa are being sought in Hall and Donley Counties by Western Alfalfa Corporation here for its 1971 ground alfalfa program.

"In order to produce quality cuttings for next year, seed must be fall-planted," said Hap Kensinger, Western Alfalfa Panhandle District General Manager Contracts should be signed prior to September 15.

"We are interested in contracting irrigated land of more than 30acre fields so we can program for 1971," Kensinger said in pointing out that his company will pay \$16 per ton for alfalfa. "Growers must plant, irrigate and tend the alfalfa

We will cut and grind it to our specifications."
