NUMBER THREE ON THE BALLOT (SJR15) General Election Nov. 3, 1970

STATE OF TEXAS:

"Section 1-d. The Legislature shall have the power to provide by law for the establishment of a uniform method of assessment of ranch, farm and forest lands, which shall be based upon the capability of such lands to support the raising of livestock and/or to produce farm and forest crops rather than upon the value of such lands and the crop growing thereon."

NUMBER SIX ON THE BALLOT (SJR32) General Election Nov. 3, 1970

BE IT RESOLVED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS:
Section 1. That Section 51, Article XVI, Constitution of the State of Texas be amended to read as follows:

"Section 51. The homestead, not in a town or city, shall consist of not more than two hundred acres of land, which may be in one or more parcels, with the improvements thereon; the homestead in a city, town or village, shall consist of lot, or lots, not to exceed in value Ten Thousand Dollars, at the time of their designation as the homestead, without reference to the value of any improvements thereon: provided, that the same shall be used for the purposes of a sale."



PUBLIC NOTICE Proposed CONSTITUTIONAL AMENDMENT

General Election Nov. 3, 1970 NUMBER FOUR ON THE BALLOT (HJR15)

BE IT RESOLVED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS:
Section 1. That Article III, Section 51-b, Subsection (a), Constitution of the State of Texas, be amended to read as follows:

"(a) The State Building Commission is created and succeeds to the powers and duties heretofore vested in the agency of the same name by this Constitution and to the powers and duties the Legislature has vested or may vest in the Commission. Its membership shall consist of three Texas citizens appointed by the Governor with the advice and consent of the Senate. The term of each member shall be six years except in the first appointments to the Commission as a three-member appointive commission."

Alfalfa Contracts Being Sought

Memphis, Texas-Contracts for a minimum of 5,000 acres of irri gated alfalfa are being sought in Hall and Donley Counties by Western Alfalfa Corporation here for its 1971 ground alfalfa program

"In order to produce quality cuttings for next year, seed must be fall-planted," said Hap Kensinger, Western Alfalfa Panhandle District General Manager Contracts should be signed prior to September 15.

"We are interested in contracting irrigated land of more than 30 acre fields so we can program for 1971," Kensinger said in pointing out that his company will pay \$16 per ton for alfalfa "Growers must plant, irrigate and tend the alfalfa




