

ture's Food Stamp Program inwages or receive public assistance or a small pension check, and who

cannot be used to pay for meals at restaurants, and are not good for imported foods or nen-food items, such as soap, paper goods and liquor.

Food stamps give low-income families more food buying power. For example, a family of four with an income of \$155 a month will pay \$42 each month and receive food coupons worth \$106
