The Donley County Insect Control Assn. and the Texas Dept. of Agriculture has hired James Potts to check cotton fields of members of the Assn for boll weevil. He will check fields each week that members of the Assn think they will spray. An insect report will be given to the producer and to the Donley County Insect Control Assn on each field every week.

**Food Stamp Program**

Donley County low-income families interested in the Food Stamp Program should contact Mrs. Helen Phelps, the local caseworker with the Texas Department of Public Welfare.

She is at the welfare office in the county courthouse annex in Clarendon on Wednesday of each week, reports Lester Woods, welfare unit supervisor, Pampa. The program opened in Donley County on Aug 19

Issuance of food stamps will be made on Wednesday of the first full week of each month and during the third week.

In general, families eligible for the U S Department of Agriculture's Food Stamp Program include those who work for low wages or receive public assistance or a small pension check, and who cook food at home. Food stamps

cannot be used to pay for meals at restaurants, and are not good for imported foods or non-food items, such as soap, paper goods and liquor.

Food stamps give low-income families more food buying power. For example, a family of four with an income of \$155 a month will pay \$42 each month and receive food coupons worth \$106. The difference is made up by "bonus" coupons paid for by federal funds.

Food stamps are used just like money at local groceries authorized by USDA's Food and Nutrition Service to accept them, and are redeemed at cooperating banks through the Federal Reserve System.
