## Donley County Crusade For Christ

Plans are currently being made and consummated by members of eight churches in Donley County for the Donley County Crusade For Christ which will be conducted Sept. 20-27.

William Lowe, Clarendon attorney, is serving as the general chairman in preparation for the Crusade. He is being assisted by numerous people from the various churches and denominations involved in the Crusade For Christ.

The Evangelist for the Crusade will be Rev. Ed Robb. Rev. Robb committed his life to evangelistic service in 1946 while serving in the U. S. Navy.
