## Lone Star Gas Building New Service Center

Dallas (Nov. 10, 1970)—Lone Star Gas Co. is constructing a new regional service center in Wichita Falls, Tex., according to George A. Graffeo, Project Coordinator of Lone Star's Building Management Department. This 14,000 square foot structure will be the newest and largest facility for a regional service center in the Lone Star system.

The new facility will provide 24 hour a day dispatcher service for the Wichita Falls metropolitan area. Features of the one-story building located on Gregory Street will include an employee meeting room, a coffee-lunch area, an appliance make-ready room, and ample parking space for its approximately 70 employees.

M. A. Vordenbaum & Sons, Wichita Falls, is the prime contractor, and Pardue, Reed & Dice, also of Wichita Falls, provided the architectural design. The project will be completed in approximately eight months.

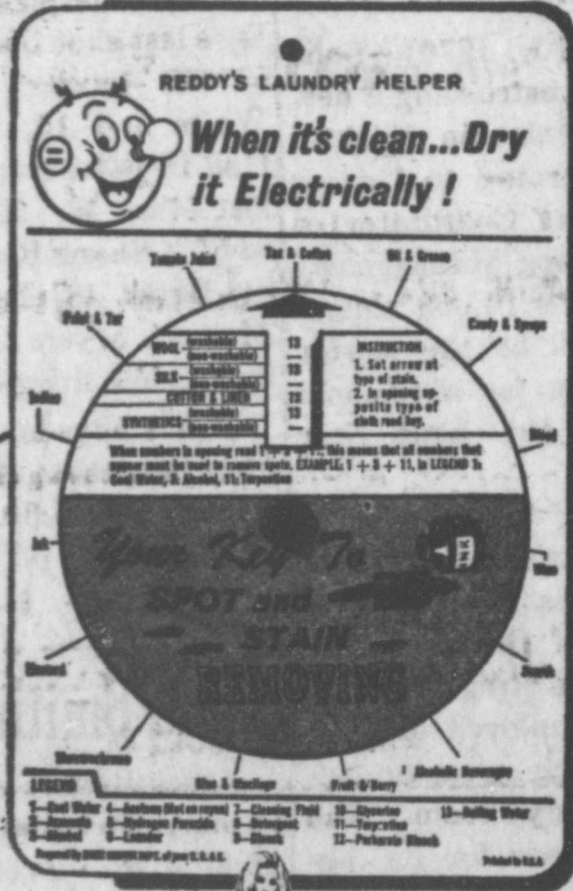

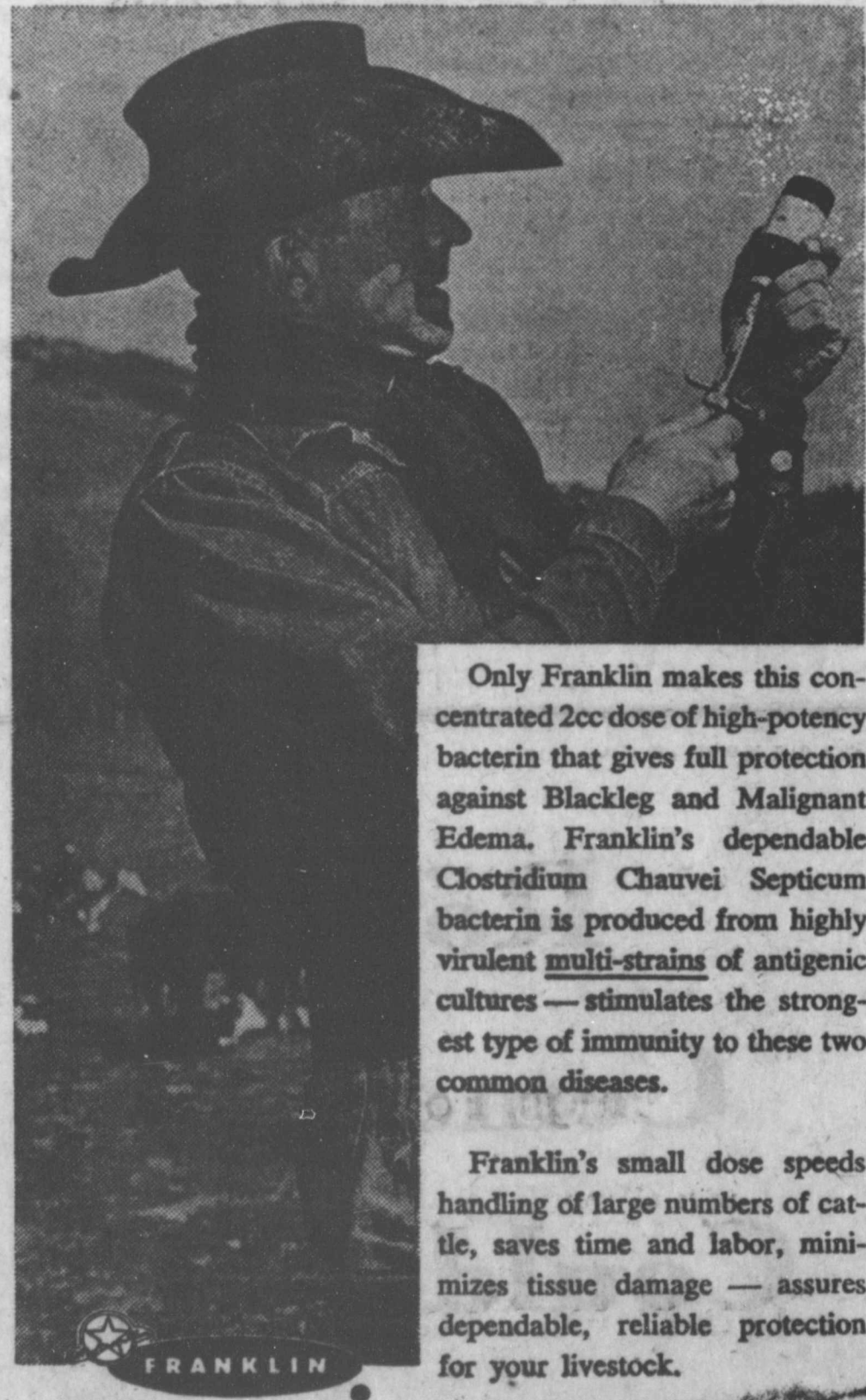

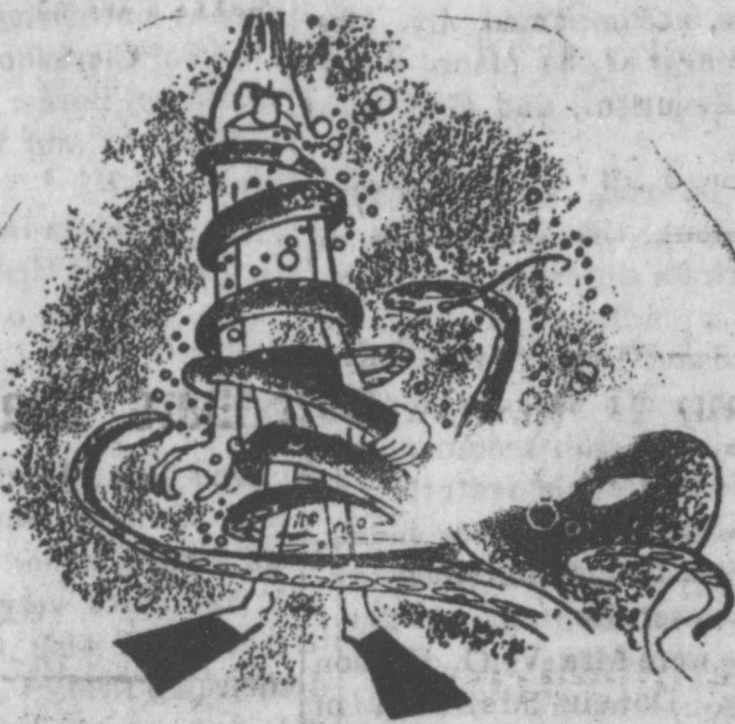
