Cotton harvest reached its peak last week in the Memphis territory according to W. E. Cain, at the USDA, Consumer and Marketing Service Classing office in Memphis, Texas. Farmers stripped cotton all week except for two afternoons when high winds kept them out of the fields.

Last week 12,700 samples were classed to bring the season total to 23,900. Last year at this same date 27,100 samples had been graded.
