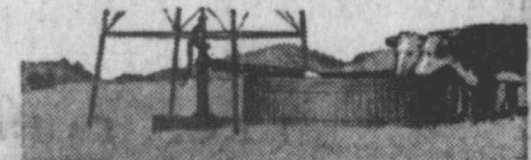



The Texas Highway Patrol investigated eight accidents on rural highways in Donley County during the month of December, according to Sergeant Vernon Cawthon, Highway Patrol supervisor of this area.

These crashes resulted in two persons killed and an estimated property damage of \$11,745.

The rural accident summary for this county during the calendar year of 1970 shows a total of 60 accidents resulting in five persons killed, 33 persons injured, and an estimated property damage of \$107,967

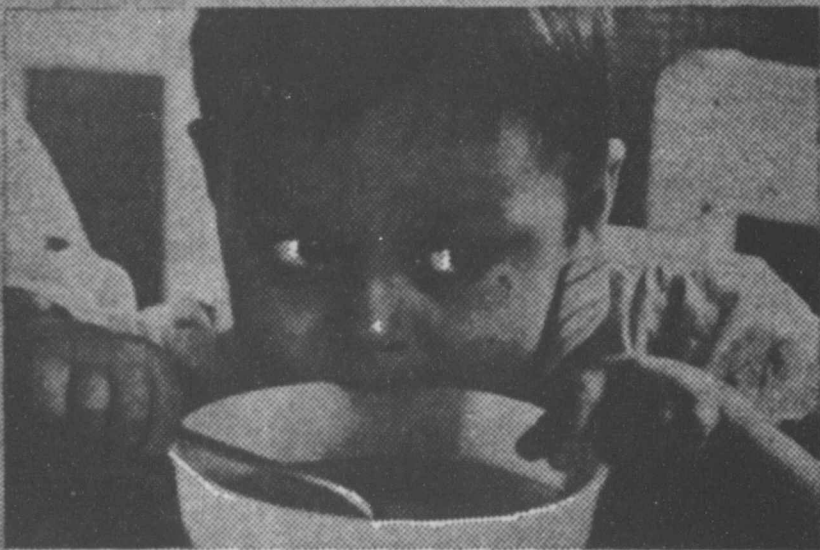
