Friday the girls met Quitaque in the tournament finals. Renee White led all scorers with 15 points as Hedley won 34 to 27. Gail Holland had 13 and Tanya White 6 for Hedley.

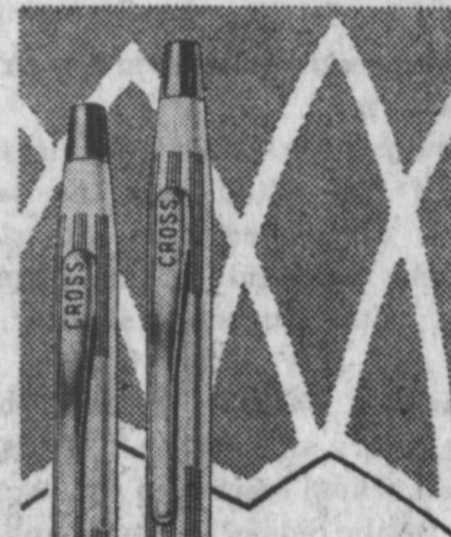

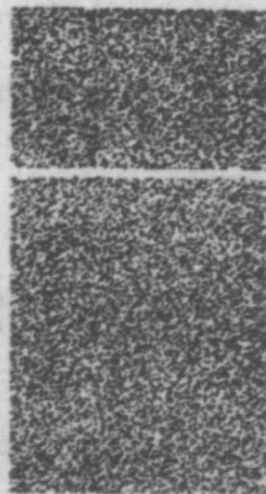
