Bob Couch of Gallup, N. Mex., a former Hedleyan, will again be the head teacher this year for another pilot program at Ramah, N. Mex.

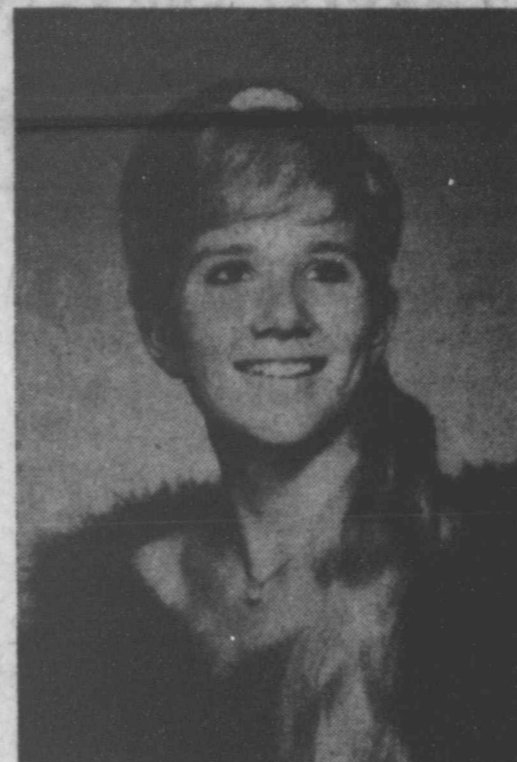
